LESSON RECAP This week we learned about a man named Nicodemus who we read about in the book of John in the Bible. Nicodemus had lots of questions about Jesus and what God's plan was. We talked about some of the questions we might have when it comes to God's plan. Here were some of the questions we discussed:

- Why did God send Jesus? People had been separated from God ever since sin first entered the scene (all the way back to Adam and Eve). Try as we might, humans just can't get rid of sin by ourselves. But God came up with a way so that we would no longer have to be separated from God. That's where Jesus comes in.

- Why would God do that for us? Jesus explains that love was the reason Jesus came to die for our sins. Love is also the reason why Jesus came back to life. God's love is what the whole plan is built on. God loves everyone in the world so much wants everyone to find their way back to God.

- How do we do that? God's plan was to save everyone from their sins. God does all the hard part. All people have to do is believe!
