#### LESSON RECAP

Long ago, many people traveled a long way to celebrate a Jewish holiday called the Passover, a special day of remembrance for God's people. Jesus came to Jerusalem to celebrate in the temple, like everyone else. But once he got there, Jesus saw things going on at the temple that were not a part of God's plan... and He spoke up. In fact, Jesus did more than that – Jesus flipped over tables and made a pretty big statement about how displeasing this was. Jesus was very upset and made everyone leave the temple, and people wondered how Jesus had any power to do that. Jesus answered them by talking about the plans God had-plans that were bigger than the ones they had been making. Jesus shared the plan of how God would destroy and rebuild the temple. This was confusing to everyone because the temple was this massive, super special, and holy place. But what they didn't know was that Jesus was talking about what was going to happen later when Jesus died on the cross for everyone's sins. Eventually, what Jesus said came true! Jesus' disciples remembered later what Jesus said and believed God's plan! God had one all along! This week, we learned how God's Word-the Bible, helps us know God's plan, and we can trust God's words and God's plan and follow His commands because God is perfect, and He will never lead us to a plan that isn't good for us.
