## To form a non-profit

### Still deciding and progress

Whether I decide to form my own non-profit depends on how the different efforts play out. However, I am taking steps in that direction. I plan to use this space to update you on progress both in the decision-making, and in the steps toward creating that non-profit.

I have chosen a tentative name (Science for All). I still need to check that with the MD state website to make sure it is not already in use. I have a purpose: Change science education to encourage more understanding of and trust in science by all high school graduates.

### **Current updates on efforts**

This panel of the newsletter will contain updates on the various efforts I am making.

Here are my top current ideas:

- Develop a clearing house that includes science educational content available on the web, as well as a continuously updated list of national, state, and local upcoming decisions related to science education: Status: I may have found a home for this within an existing non-profit and I am in the process of writing a proposal
- 2) Top Gun Academy: Develop a summer enrichment program that employs expert teachers to train other teachers while providing fun, hands-on enrichment to students struggling or less engaged with science. Status: I am looking for a potential venue, with a stretch goal of starting in summer 2023
- Work with organizations such as Reading is Fundamental to encourage them to include age-appropriate science books in their offerings. Status: I have contacted RIF and need to re-engage.
- 4) Work with Society for Science to use their archived articles to engage high schoolers in science based on their non-science interests: Status: assessment of archives completed; Upcoming poll of science teachers to see if it will be useful to them.
