A Message from our CEO & Founder

Two years wow! I can't believe it has been two years. A simple goal of 215 plus one block to make 18 quilts by sharing a post on social media. I still am in awe of all that has been accomplished since that first post.

I went from a simple idea to a sea of fabric, thread, blocks, and fabric coming to my door daily. It grew so quickly that the postal workers were wondering what I was up to.

A simple idea to honour and comfort those whose journeys took them on a path no child, no person should ever have to walk. The idea to present quilts to honour the children who made it home changed in so many ways from the child they were when they left. To also honouring the children who never made it home and whose childhood was stolen within the walls of a building that should never have been called a school.

What an honour to be a part of the healing journey of so many resilient, strong, powerful people. My people are the Indigenous people of the nations of Turtle Island who through their suffering saved our nations, our people, our culture, and our traditions. What an honour to give a simple gift made by many hands to show our support and limited understanding of their pain.

We cannot take away the memories, the hurt change the past. Today, and every day we choose to listen, learn, grow, and walk beside you.

Many of us are here because of your resilience. I am here a mother, quilter, businesswoman, a leader, all the while being Indigenous. I am very proud of my heritage. I am very proud of the strength of my people.

Thank you to all the survivors who accept our humble gifts of love. We do this to honour you.

Thank you to the hundreds of volunteers, supporters, and sponsors. We have made it this far because you are walking with us. Helping us reach for goals we never dreamed of. Quilts for Survivors is making a difference in part because of you.

Our Vision: To see that all living survivors receive a quilt.

















A look back at the last Two Years

We are also looking for donations of batting and backing.




Quilts will be put together and given to the chieftain of First Nation communities to be give to a residential school survivor. I know that trying to make one for every survivor would be hard and would take years. But we will do what we can.

I believe that this is a way to give back to the communities that are hurt with the recent discovery of remains on former residential schools land.

June 2022: Vanessa started working at QFS



December 2022: Went to Bella Coola, BC to present Quilts



I can't believe it's July already!


I had a blast in Halifax attending my very first quilting conference!

I enjoyed every second of it! I had a great day and got to go in the ocean and collect some treasures to bring home.


I loved making new friends and am very excited to go to the next Quilts Canada! I hope to see you in Edmonton next year!!
