#### A message from your CEO and Founder

For the child taken, For the parent left behind." (TRC Interim Report, 2021)

This month I attended the fourth NTIONAL Gathering on Unmarked Burials held in Toronto, Ontario. Check out their website or email <a href="https://osi-bis.ca">https://osi-bis.ca</a> email <a href="mailto:info@osi-bis.ca">info@osi-bis.ca</a>

Quilts for Survivors is focusing on providing comfort, support, healing and quilts to living survivors and their families. We do this through our work making and presenting the quilts. We acknowledge residential school, day school, 60s scoop survivors from First Nations, Inuit, and Metis communities. It is an honour to work with so many supports across Turtle Island and the world to help make and send our gifts of love.

As I sit here thinking about what to say my mind, heart and spirit are thinking of the children, our ancestors that didn't make it home. I think of the parents who live and some who passed over without ever knowing what happened to their children their babies. I cannot relate to this loss, this feeling of uncertainty. I do not know how these parents, families feel. I do know the loss of a child through miscarriage I have had two. I know what it feels like to hope, plan, dream of a little one coming into our family and then having those dreams and plans come to an end shortly after they began.

I do not know of the pain of having your young child taken by strangers. Strangers who said that they could educate them better than you. They did not promise to love them, to comfort them, to encourage them to be the person the Creator wanted them to be. We know that the children did not have a good life at these schools. We know that these schools were created to take the Indian out of the child. Kill the Indian, Keep the child. That was not the case with the children, our children who never made it home. The government, churches tried to kill the Indian and keep the child only to lose the child. This speaks to me. As I sit here, I am moved to a thought I have not had before. The goal was to Keep the child, yet so many of our children never made it home. They died at those schools. Why? I have come to the realization that the goal of these institutions was an impossible goal. You cannot take a part of a person's core and expect them to live. Our children where not "Indians" as a choice. We are Indians, Indigenous because we were created to be one. The Creator weaved our culture, traditions, beliefs, and language throughout our DNA. The belief that we can separate ourselves from this is to me the same as believing that someone can live without oxygen. That is why the goal of these institutions failed. They were trying to undo the Creator's work.

As I close, I wish to honour my ancestors, our children who did not make it home. I ask that you take time to sit quietly and reflect on the Truth of the unmarked graves across Turtle Island. I ask that you offer a prayer to Creator to help heal the communities, families, and Nations whose children never returned home. It will take the country to heal our Nations. We all have a role to play in that healing.

Creator, we thank you for your love, guidance, and strength. We ask that you guild the leaders of our nations that are working to protect, uncover the graves of our children. We ask that you send love to the nations, families and survivors as more information will come from these former sites. We ask that you protect them so that they might heal as this journey is not yet over. We ask for strength for our elders, leaders, and supporters as they continue this important work to find and bring home our children. We also ask for the wisdom and knowledge to know how that should look for all nations. We ask that you protect our youth and future children from harm, shame and guilt our nations have known for to long. We ask that they can carry our nations into a future where there are no more unmarked graves, where are children are found and celebrated as the warriors they are. May we always celebrate them and their purpose. May our youth grow to be great leaders, parents, community members and a blessing to all who they interact with. We say Kitchi Meegwetch for the strength of our people, our communities, and our Nations. We than k you for our elders, leaders, and allies. We say to you Creator Kitchi Meegwetch, Meegwetch


