I'm excited to share with you our latest monthly newsletter, packed with lots of updates and new information for Quilters, Volunteers, and Survivors.

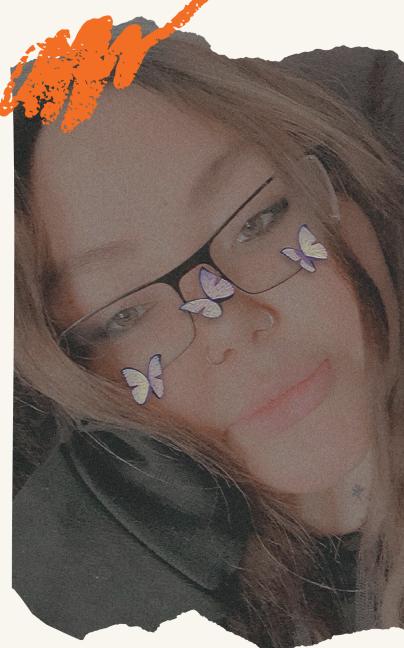
I am looking forward to a few events coming up for Quilts For Survivors, such as Quilt Canada 2024 and our Sewing Retreat!

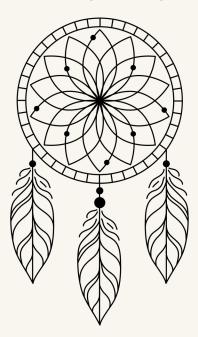
The more people we can teach the better, so that we can continue this healing work for Survivors and ourselves.

This is the letter Hazel originally sent to Vanessa in August of 2021. Hazel has since sent us many sheets of labels to add to our quilts. We will be forever thankful that she chose to help Survivors in this way.

Dear Vanessa

It was truly heartbreaking to hear about the 215 children's graves found in B.C., and more across the country. And to learn that my ancestors had done such a horrible disgraceful act. It has been on my mind every day since.

A couple of weeks back, I saw you and your quest to make quilts for survivors on the news. I really wanted to take part and do something. I am not one who can sew very well, but I still really wanted to do something.

I am not on Facebook, but I am able to see your public postings and videos of the fantastic blocks and quilts that people have made and sent you on the Quilts for Survivors website. It is so amazing of all the heartfelt contributions you have received.

Through your video postings, I have learned that you are Cree and are from the Eagle Clan. And that is where I noticed your mother hand writes (with a sharpie) some labels for the quilts. Tada, light bulb went off!!!

I'm a 65 year old gal who likes to do graphics. So, during the past few weeks, I decided to put my creative talents to work and made something different for you.

After some research, I have learned that Eagle feather symbolizes respect, honour, strength, courage and wisdom. And a feather from this magnificent bird is treasured as a badge of honour.

So, I have created a design and then had a local screen printer make them up for me.

Ø The Eagle feather represents your clan, to signify to be strong in order to overcome challenges;

Ø The center stem represents the center of our being, center of our creation:

Ø And inscribed "Quilts for Survivors 2021".

It has taken me a few weeks to get this together for you. I hope you like it!

So, enclosed, you will find 260 logos that can be individually cut out and sewn to your quilts. If you wish, some can be cut into blocks.

You are truly an inspirational person, and we need more people like you in our world.

I am honoured to be a part of this mission. Happiness and love to you and your family.

What kind of fabric is used?

100% cotton quilting fabric

What size of blocks are needed?

16.5 inches square

Are there any restrictions on the blocks?

Our Fabric Restrictions are posted on our website. No Religious fabric, School related fabric, Travel related fabric, Graphic illustrations or images, or Gang related fabrics.

Can I donate something other than a block or a quilt?

Yes! We are accepting monetary donations, supplies, and more. Please visit our Wishlist, see page 15 for the link and more information.

Can we donate tops or completed quilts?

Yes, tops should be 48" x 64" or lap size. Completed quilts can be any size.
