As part of our commitment to reach out to local first nations people, OVQG has made more than 30 quilts for the Westbank First Nations survivors of residential school system and other trauma.


Quilts will be on display from May 2 to July 30 at the Rotary Centre for the Arts in Kelowna and then gifted to the Westbank First Nations.



Stories from Suvivors & Volunteers

"The D.O.T.S. Quilt Guild (Dunnville's Own Tiny Stitchers) had a display table at Dunnville's Home and Garden Show in April to bring about awareness of their community efforts and beyond. The hopes were to recruit more members to our Guild. On display were quilts from our Comfort Quilts Group who make quilts for those who are sick, going through cancer treatments or have suffered some sort of tragedy such as a house fire.

Besides locally, quilts have been sent all over Canada including High River, Alberta; Humboldt, Saskatchewan;

A pet beds display was featured showing beds we make from our scraps and pillow cases that we donate to the S.P.C.A. These beds go home with the pets as they are adopted.

and Prince Edward Island storm victims.

Our display also showed our involvement with Quilts for Survivors. We wanted to bring further awareness to this program. A Survivor quilt made by President, Bonnie Robins was showed along with a display board posting information from the Quilts for Survivors website. The display included local newspaper articles about the quilts our Guild have sent out to Survivors across Canada. We were happy to explain to people who stopped to look at the display how Vanessa Genier started the group, what it has grown into and what they could do if interested in helping. Any inquiries for more info or to request a quilt were directed to the Quilts for Survivors website and Facebook page. Some members of The D.O.T.S. Quilt Guild have been making quilts for Survivors since 2021 and continue to do so. "



When I was young I had a quilt that hung on my bedroom wall. This quilt was created by my Granny and a few other talented quilters. It was then raffled off and as luck would have it, my Mom won the raffle! Many many many decades later, we still have this quilt. My Nana (my Great Grandmother) and my Granny (both of whom I was blessed to have known for many years) were avid quilters and my Mom, Liz, still is. The sounds of their sewing machines working away in the basement are sounds I will always remember.

Flash forward to 2021 when my Mom saw Vanessa on Facebook. Wanting to support the goal of 18 quilts, my Mom submitted some blocks. As I learned more about QFS and what my Mom was doing, I too became involved. Working together, a few blocks became many blocks, became many quilt tops, became hundreds of hand drawn cards for inclusion with the quilts when they are sent out.

Along the way, I reached out to a number of companies to see if they would be interested in supporting our efforts – a print shop in Northern Kentucky was more than happy to give me a box of card stock for us to make cards with, wanting to learn more about Residential School Survivors and what Vanessa and QFS was doing; a pencil crayon company sent me extra orange pencil crayons as those are the ones I am using up the fastest; a paper company shipped me two huge boxes of paper to make even more cards with, and many friends with fabric are sending it our way for our blocks and tops.

We are honoured to be a part of QFS, supporting the group and the Survivors on their journeys, while educating others along the way.


















Meet the Quilts for Survivors Board of Directors

A message from the editor


Hello, everyone! Happy Pride Month!
