#### **Focus on Outreach**

The goal is to ensure that quilts reach even more individuals who need the comfort and hope the quilts provide. #### **Strengthening Volunteer Engagement**

100% cotton quilting fabric

#### What size of blocks are needed?

16.5 inches square

## Are there any restrictions on the blocks?

Our Fabric Restrictions are posted on our website. No Religious fabric, School related fabric, Travel related fabric, Graphic illustrations or images, or Gang related fabrics. You can always check with us by emailing: admin@quiltsforsurvivors.ca

## Can I donate something other than a block or a quilt?

### Can we donate tops or completed quilts?

Yes, tops should be 48" x 64" or lap size. Completed quilts can be any size.
