We have started shipping out quilts after the Canada Post strike has ended and are currently shipping for November 2023. This has extended the approximate wait time to 13 months from the previous 11-12 months.

I'm especially looking forward to our Spring Break Youth Week – it's going to be an incredible time filled with connection, creativity, and fun!







What kind of fabric is used?

100% cotton quilting fabric

What size of blocks are needed?

16.5 inches square

Are there any restrictions on the blocks?

Our Fabric Restrictions are posted on our website. No Religious fabric, School related fabric, Travel related fabric, Graphic illustrations or images, or Gang related fabrics. You can always check with us by emailing: admin@quiltsforsurvivors.ca

Can I donate something other than a block or a quilt?

Yes! We are accepting monetary donations, supplies, and more. Please visit our Wishlist, see page 15 for the link and more information.

Can we donate tops or completed quilts?

Yes, tops should be 48" x 64" or lap size. Completed quilts can be any size.


