We also have updates from our Founder and CEO Vanessa Genier as well as studio updates, general questions and information, and a message from our Board Members.

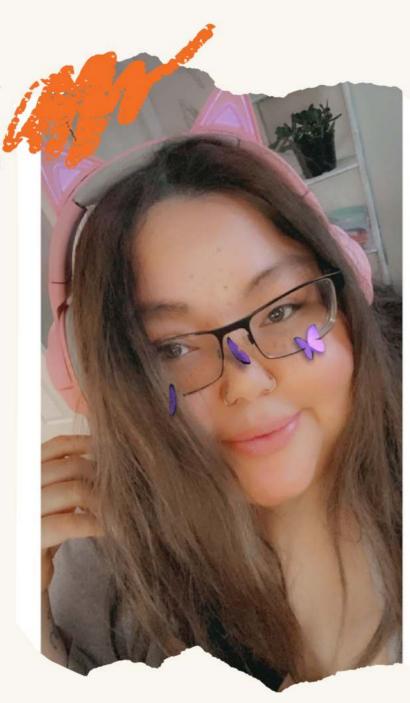

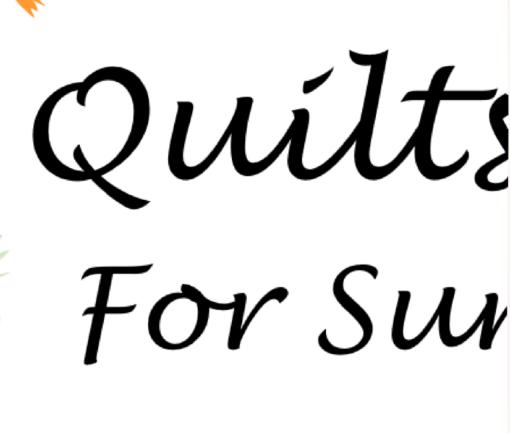

See our goals for 2024



Goals for 2024:

We would like to send out 2,000 quilts in 2024!

- · That would be 167 quilts per month.
- This would be 5.5 quilts per day.
- If the tops have 20 blocks in them, it would be 110 blocks made per day.

This would also ensure that anyone who requested quilts in 2023 would have their quilt by the end of the year.

We would like to see the wait time go down from 12+ months to 6 - 8 months.

We would like to have 25 quilts quilted in the studio per week.

We would like to have updated sewing machines.

We would like to train more volunteers on the longarm.

We want to have 1,000 quilt blocks at Quilts Canada in Edmonton June 2024 (12.5-inch blocks).

We hope to engage more sponsors and increase our donations.

We want to have more live and in person events to promote sewing, quilting and our organization.

We hope to have 100 people at our sewing retreat.

We strive to continue to move forward in a good way that honours our ancestors, brings healing and comfort, and provides a future the next generations can be proud of.

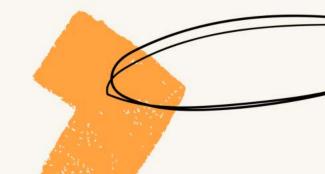

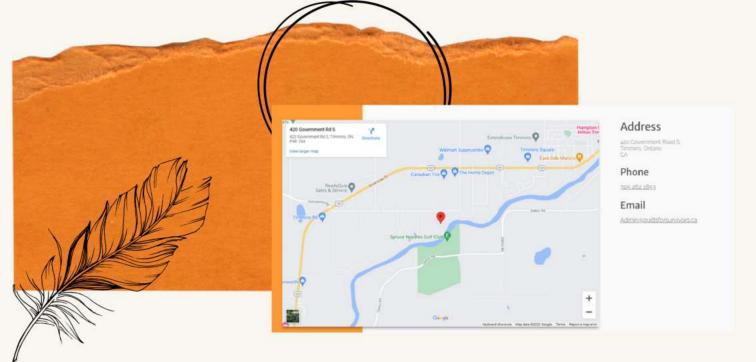

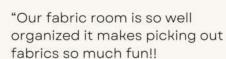

Fabric Room





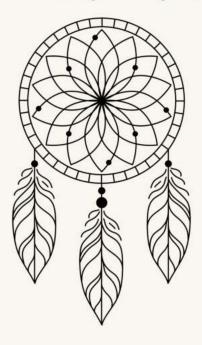


Workshops

I would go to her home where the early volunteers gathered to help. At this time I was introduced to her wonderful family. I truly am quite fond of the early days. Sizing blocks, ironing, sandwiching the quilts together. I was fascinated by the process. Katherine at that time would peak in on us now and then, as she was quite shy. Not anymore lol - except with the camera. Cheryl (Vanessa's beautiful Mom) and I made one heck of a team, both rookies to the craft we have become guilters together, and I have found someone that has turned into a lifelong friend. Watching this cause grow like it has, is beautiful to see. Vanessa is becoming known throughout our country and the recognition is well deserved. I was drawn to this cause for a few reasons. We are actually doing something that is helping Survivors heal, and not just by using our words. Providing a guilt is something that can be held, touched, smelled, provide warmth, comfort, cried into if need be. Given with love in hopes that the recipient feels it in return, unfortunately sometimes for the first time. An acknowledgement, that says yes we do understand what you have been through, we believe what you have to say. As a fellow Canadian my heart hurts deeply that this is part of our history. Through volunteering I have been able to be present when quilts have been given out. It is all quite emotional, and has brought me to tears on more than one occasion. Hearing Survivors tell their stories is a blessing, and not something that is easy to do. We are being trusted with something very private and painful to each one. Will I continue to volunteer? What kind of fabric is used?

100% cotton quilting fabric

What size of blocks are needed?

16.5 inches square

Are there any restrictions on the blocks?

Our Fabric Restrictions are posted on our website. No Religious fabric, School related fabric, Travel related fabric, Graphic illustrations or images, or Gang related fabrics.

Can I donate something other than a block or a quilt?

Can we donate tops or completed quilts?

Yes, tops should be 48" x 64" or lap size. Completed quilts can be any size.
