"Hey look, it's the orange shirt lady and the quilt lady"

Happy May! Wow April has been a wild and busy month. We started out with a trip to Toronto where I was honoured as one of the top 25 most influential women in Canada. It was a great event that I was able to share with some board members (my mom included), the CEO of the Timmins Chamber, the Mayor of Timmins and my aunt Vanessa. (you guessed it I was named after her) While in Toronto I was also able to meet Phyllis Westad, the orange shir lady, what an amazing opportunity. It was a real honour to spend just a few minutes with her and her niece. While we were chatting someone said, "Hey look, it's the orange shirt lady and the quilt lady." That made my heart and spirit very happy.

This month also marked the sending out of our 5,000th quilt. This is an amazing accomplishment for everyone involved. It doesn't matter if you have given 1 block or 50 quilts, a spool of thread or a monetary donation all of it has brought us to this point. We apricate your continued support as we continue to bring healing by making and sending quilts. There is an estimated 40,000 residential school survivors in Canada and this past weekend I just learned that there are an estimated 25,000 60s scoop survivors. While over 125,000 children went into foster care or adoption during the time that is called the 60s scoop (indigenous children take into care or adoption between 1960-1980) Most of these children where ripped from their homes, or even right from the hospital for no reason other than they were indigenous. Many of them were separated from not only their communities but also from their siblings. Many of them are just now finding their families, their nations, where they belong. Some of these children were shipped to other countries and their past wasn't shared with them. Leaving them to loose a sense of who they are and where they belong.

When starting this project, I had not heard many of the personal stories that our survivors carry with them. I had limited knowledge of what took place during this time. Now I carry many stories that have been passed on to me through meeting survivors. These stories are a part of our history as Canadians and Indigenous people. I am honoured to be a part of their stories being shared. I am humbled by the impact that our quilts are making in the lives of so many. I hear also daily how our quilts are a blessing, a gift, a token of support and they are bringing healing.

Thank you, Creator, for allowing us myself included to use our gifts to bring healing to our nations survivors. We are grateful to mother earth for giving us cotton to use to make the fabric that makes these beautiful quilts. We humbled to use our gifts in a way that has a lasting impact on so many. We will continue on until all survivors and their families have received a healing quilt. May they continue to be a blessing to those who have endured so much.

Now on to our next 5,000.






The more people we can teach the better, so that we can continue this healing work for Survivors and ourselves.

100% cotton quilting fabric

What size of blocks are needed?

16.5 inches square

Are there any restrictions on the blocks?

Our Fabric Restrictions are posted on our website. No Religious fabric, School related fabric, Travel related fabric, Graphic illustrations or images, or Gang related fabrics.
