




The definition of a "Community Band" is a concert band that is generally sponsored by the town or city in which it is located and consists of musicians whom volunteer their time and talents. The earliest community band dates back to 1828 in Allentown, Pennsylvania. Community bands most frequently perform during holidays, patriotic events and concerts in the park.

It is estimated that in the very early 1900's there were 10,000 such bands in the United States. At the end of WW I there was a dying off of community bands due largely to automobiles, new mass media and a large cultural shift. There are approximately 2,500 community bands across the United States at this time.

Preservation of our heritage - The Community Band - is our mission. We are comprised of musicians from ages 15 to 78 - amateur to professional musicians obscure to world renowned musicians - students to composers and former music educators. All of our musicians do this because of their love of music and desire to "give back" some of what they have been blessed with.

About the Band

The Brevard Community Band was formed in April of 2001. The band has about 50 musicians ranging in experience from amateurs, who have a "burning desire" to continue their musical interest, to professionals, both still active as well as retirees. The band meets in the Band Room of Dunham Hall at Brevard College every Thursday evening at 7: 00 pm. for rehearsals. Plans for 2007 are for five performances from May to September. The band has two "formal" concerts which are performed at the Porter Center in early June and mid-September. The other performances are under the Gazebo in downtown Brevard, at the Transylvania Library, and an outreach program at the College Walk Retirement Center.

Purpose

The purpose of the Brevard Community Band is to:

- Organize, encourage, conduct, maintain and promote interest in bands, concerts and music appreciation.
- Allow individuals and groups to express their musical talents through participation in bands and groups.
- 3. Secure the interest of patrons of music.
- 4. Provide an opportunity for contact among qualified musicians.
- Reaffirm the community concert band position in American music.

Our Director



Jamie Hafner is Director Emeritus of Bands at The University of Toledo and Director Emeritus of Education at the Brevard Music Center. Mr. Hafner served as president of the Mid American Conference Band Directors Association and has degrees from the University of Cincinnati College

Conservatory of Music. He has been an Honorary Fellow in Conducting at the University of Wisconsin and the University of Michigan.

Hafner has been honored with memberships in many fraternities including Pi Kappa Lambda, a music honorary fraternity, Phi Beta Mu, a national bandmasters honorary fraternity, an honorary member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, a national music fraternity and Kappa Kappa Psi, an honorary music fraternity

As a tubist, Hafner has performed with the United States Military Band at West Point, the Savannah Symphony, the Toledo Symphony, The University of Toledo Faculty Brass Quintet, and the Brevard Music Center Orchestra. Last year he was a featured soloist with the Brevard Community Band. Hafner was a founding member of the International Tuba-Euphonium Association and has been commended by that group for his service as a teacher and performer.

As a conductor, Professor Hafner has earned the praises of composers Ulysses Kay, Vincent Persichetti, Robert Ward, Karel Husa, Fisher Tull, Martin Mailman, Ron Nelson and others for interpretation of their music. In 1974, Professor Hafner received University of Toledo's Outstanding Teaching Award, an honor he holds in high esteem.

Mr. Hafner is also is also a member of the National Association of Professional Band Instrument Repair Technicians and maintains a shop specializing in repair and restoration of wind instruments.

Member's Responsibilities

To enhance the band experience for everyone, band members have responsibilities to the group. Members are expected to:

- Be warmed-up and tuned prior to the start of rehearsal at 7:00 pm. Most members arrive at 6:30 for this purpose.
- Come to rehearsals prepared to play their parts. Practice at home is important.
- Notify the director if you cannot attend a rehearsal or concert. E-mail is preferable.
- Ensure that music is at rehearsal if you cannot attend.
- Assist with equipment set-up and takedown if physically capable.

A Message from the Board

The definition of a "community band" is a concert band that is generally sponsored by the town or city in which it is located and consists of musicians who volunteer their time and talents. The earliest community band dates back to 1828 in Allentown, Pennsylvania. Community bands most frequently perform during holidays, patriotic events, concerts in the park and at community centers.

It is estimated that in the late 1800's and very early 1900's there were 10,000 such bands in the United States. At the end of WW I, there was a "dying off" of community bands due largely to automobiles, new mass media and a large cultural shift. There are and community bands across the United States at this time.

BAND HISTORY

The Brevard Community Band (BCB), now in its 7th season, was formed in April of 2000. Dr. David Kirby, Director of Bands at Brevard College, was the first director of the BCB. In 2004 Dr. Kirby accepted a new position that took him from Brevard. Again the band was most fortunate in securing Paul Barber, BCB 1st Trombonist, as Artistic Director and Conductor. Mr. Barber's extensive experience with conducting community bands was a great asset to the BCB. After Mr. Barber's unexpected death, Jamie Hafner, Director Emeritus of the Brevard Music Center and the University of Toledo, accepted the position of Interim Director until a permanent conductor could be found.

The BCB is an entirely volunteer, non-profit (501c3) civic organization serving the Brevard area. The band currently has 60 musicians ranging in experience from amateurs to professionals. The purpose of the BCB is to promote interest in music through the community band experi-
