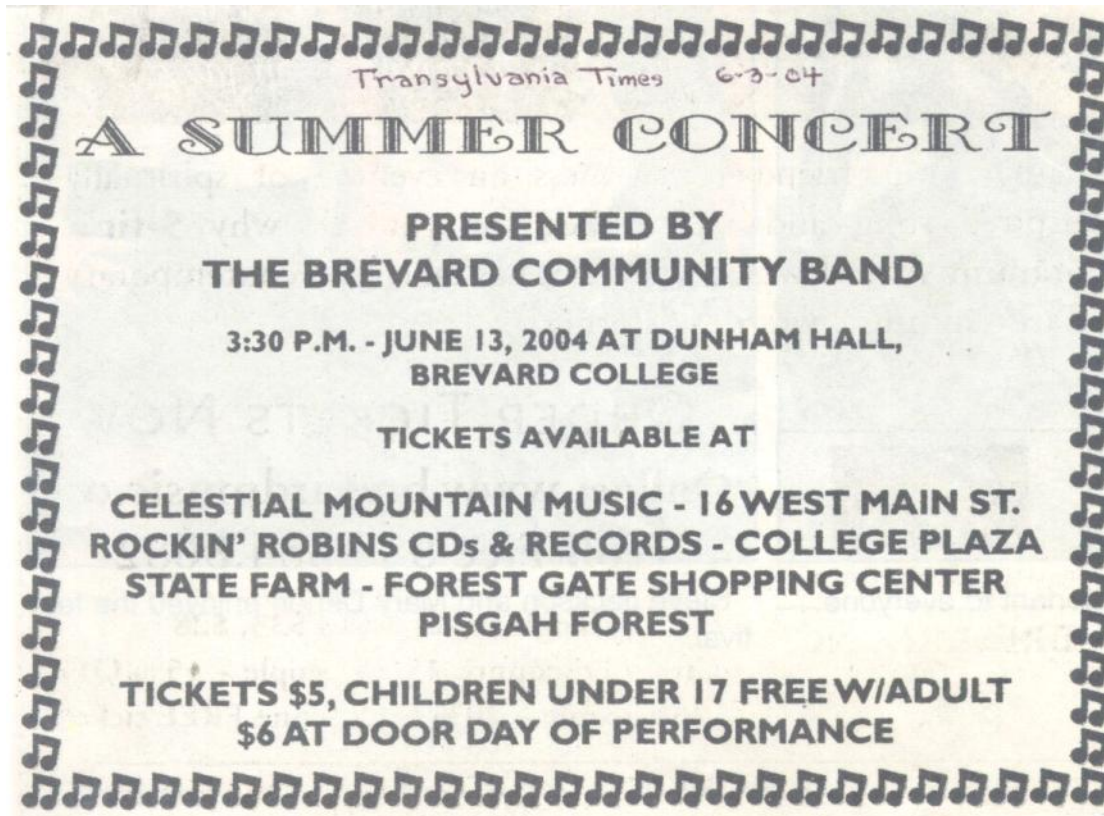

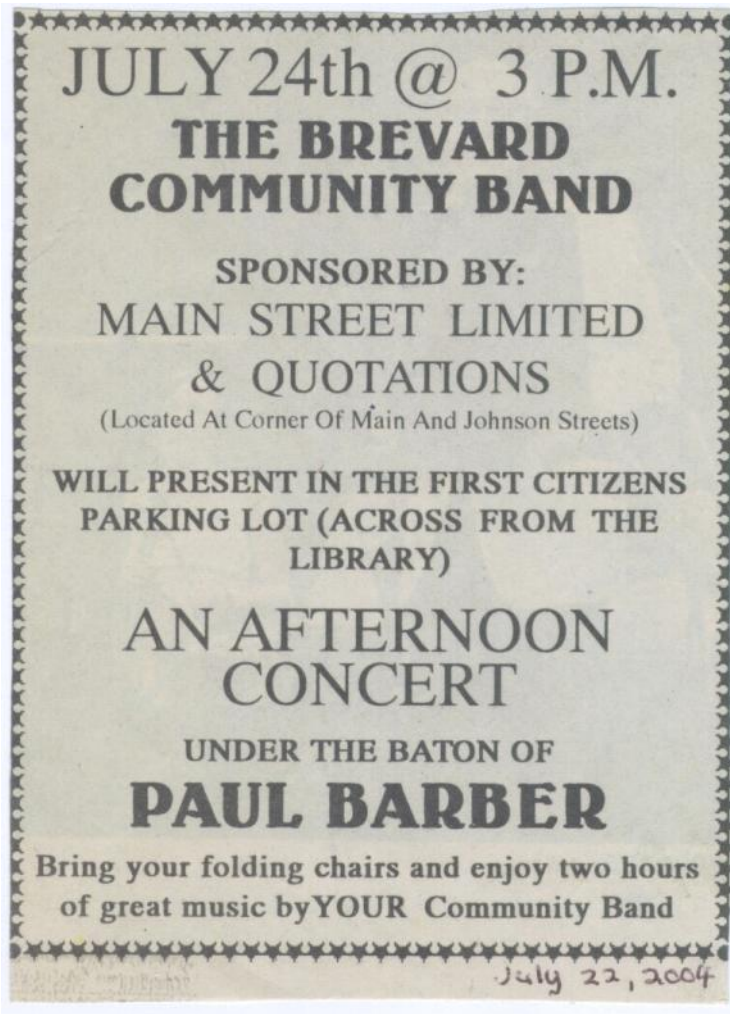

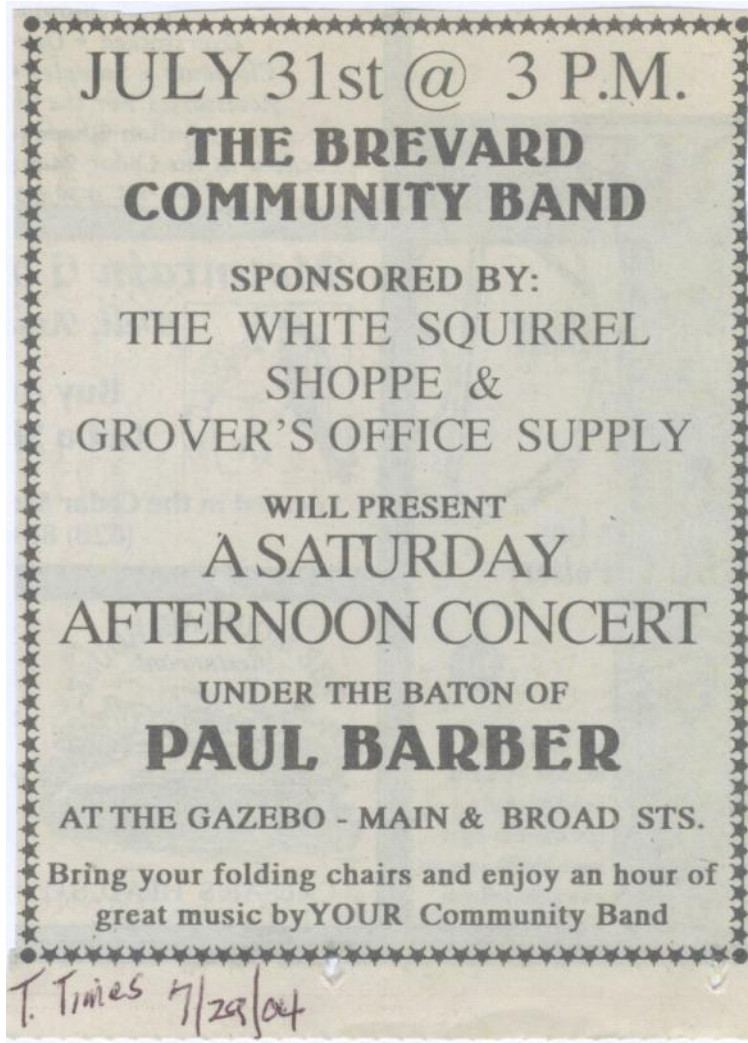

# Community Band Concert Features Classics

The Brevard Community Band will present a Fall Concert in Dunham Hall on the Brevard College Campus on September 19th at 3:30 p.m. Under the baton of Paul Barber, the band will present a variety of concert band music from George Gershwin's "An American In Paris" to "Chorale and Alleluia" by Howard Hansen to "The Stars and Stripes Forever" by John Phillip Sousa.

With solos by two of the band's outstanding musicians, Andrew Balent and Emerson Head, this concert will be one of the most entertaining concerts of the four years the band has been providing to the community. Mr. Balent, alto saxophone soloist, will play "Introduction and Samba" by Maurice Whitney. Andy, a professional musician is also a well known composer and arranger for band, orchestra, chorus and instrumental ensembles and has performed with such noted musicians as Henry Mancini, Natalie Cole, The Temptations and Gladys Knight. He has received over 25 ASCAP Special Awards for composition, which are written for all levels, but he specializes in music for young musicians. Balent is a graduate of the University of Michigan where he received both his Bachelor and Masters degrees in Music.

Dr. Emerson Head will perform "Dramatic Essay" by

Clifton Williams. For over 40 years Dr. Head has had an impressive career as a trumpet soloist, recitalist, teacher, clinician, conductor and orchestra performer. Best known as a soloist, he has performed in many of the major symphony halls, receiving the highest critical acclaim. Dr. Head retired in 1998 as Professor Emeritus in the School of Music at the University of Maryland, where he was Professor of Trumpet. During his 40 years as a professional musician, he was principal trumpet for the Theater Chamber Players of the Kennedy Center, the Feline Center Orchestra at Wolf Trap Farm Park, the Washington (DC) Ballet, the Washington Concert Opera, and the National Chamber Orchestra. In his "spare time" he occasionally performed with the Baltimore and National Symphony Orchestra, the Smithsonian Chamber Orchestra, the National Gallery Orchestra, and at the National Theater. He is also a graduate of the Brevard Music Center where he spent 18 summers, first as a student, then as faculty member and principal trumpet in the Festival Orchestra.

Dr. Head will be joined by two other professional trumpeters, Bill Shank and Jay Carrigan, to perform The Three Trumpeters by G. Agostini. The Brevard Community Band has been

blessed with many experienced and professional musicians who have retired in our area.

The band will be presenting their annual scholarship to a deserving student in the Brevard College Department of Music at this concert.

There will also be a raffle for Gift Certificates from three of our fine local restaurants, Hobnob, The Falls Landing, and Jason's Main Street Grill.

Tickets for the September 19th performance may be purchased at Celestial Mountain Music at 16 West Main Street, at Rockin' Robin's CDs and Records in the College Plaza Shopping Center (on North Broad Street across from Brevard College), and at the State Farm Insurance Office at 310 Forest Gate Shopping Center in Pisgah Forest. Advanced tickets are \$5, \$6 at the door the day of the concert. As in the past all children age 16 and under are admitted Free when accompanied by an adult. ### ANDY BALENT

Andrew Balent studied saxophone with Larry Teal at the University of Michigan. He has played in many concert bands, dance bands and show bands for many years. He has performed with Henry Mancini, Natalie Cole, The Temptations, Gladys Knight, and many others. Andy also is a leading composer and arranger of educational music with over 500 published compositions and arrangements for band, orchestra, chorus, and instrumental ensembles. Having received over 25 ASCAP Special Awards for composition, his published works are written for all levels, but he has specialized in music for young musicians. Mr. Balent taught elementary through high school levels for 30 years in Michigan and received both his Bachelor and Masters degrees from the University of Michigan. He has been a clinician and guest conductor in 45 states, as well as in Canada, Europe, and South America.

### DR. EMERSON HEAD

Emerson Head has had an impressive career as a trumpet soloist, recitalist, teacher, clinician, conductor and orchestral performer. Best known as a soloist, he has performed in many of the major symphony halls, receiving the highest critical acclaim. In 1994 he toured as a soloist in five European countries, and in 1996 was a soloist and guest professor at Seoul National University in South Korea. He retired in 1998 as Professor Emeritus in the School of Music at the University of Maryland, where he was Professor of Trumpet. When he retired from 40 years of freelance orchestral work in Washington, DC, in 2002, he was principal trumpet for the Theater Chamber Players of the Kennedy Center, the Filene Center Orchestra at Wolf Trap Farm Park, the Washington Ballet, the Washington Concert Opera, and the National Chamber Orchestra, and had performed occasionally with the Baltimore and National Symphony Orchestras, the Smithsonian Chamber Orchestra, the National Gallery Orchestra and at the National Theater. He has spent 18 summers at the Brevard Music Center, first as a student, then as principal trumpet in the Festival Orchestra. A native of Wilmington, NC, he is an honor graduate of the University of Michigan, where he received the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees, and later received a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The Catholic University of America.

### Whitmire Receives Music Scholarship

Brevard native Aaron Whitmire was recently awarded a \$500 scholarship from the Brevard Community Band.

Whitmire is a sophomore trumpet major studying with Todd Jenkins, instructor of music at Brevard College.

He is the son of Victoria and Terry Whitmire and a graduate of Rosman High School.

The purpose of the Brevard Community Band scholarship is to offer financial support to a talented and deserving Brevard College music student whose studies concentrate on brass, woodwinds, or percussion instruments.

As a scholarship recipient, Whitmire will also be a featured performer in one of the Community Band's future concerts.

Whitmire was selected to receive the scholarship by a committee comprised of Brevard College faculty members.

"The music department and the Community Band have a strong working relationship, which I view as mutually beneficial," said S. Kay Hoke, professor of music and chair of the Division of Fine Arts at Brevard College. "We are very pleased that the Community Band has chosen to direct some of the proceeds from its concerts to a scholarship for one of our stu-

dents. I think there is no better way for them to express their support for the future of music than by assisting a talented young person."

Only one scholarship was awarded. The Community Band makes this award periodically as their funds permit. This is the second time the Community Band has awarded the scholarship.

The Brevard Community Band wants to encourage students who currently perform in the College's Symphonic Winds and hopes that these students will continue to perform in a band after graduation.
