

The Brevard Community Band, Inc. will present a summer concert on June 15 (Father's Day), under the direction of Dr. David Kirby. The concert will be at 3:30 p.m. in Dunham Auditorium on the Brevard College Campus. This will be a great way to celebrate Father's Day ...remember children under age 17 are admitted free accompanied by an adult!

The program will offer a balance between stirring marches like "Sabre and Spurs" by John Phillip Sousa, Broadway show-

stoppers, "Blue Tango" by LeRoy Anderson, selections from the musical "Brigadoon," the "Princess of India Overture" by K.L. King.

Advance tickets are \$5, \$6 at the door. Tickets before the concert may be purchased from Celestial Mountain Music at 16 West Main Street, and Rockin' Robins Records and CDs in College Plaza on North Broad Street across from Brevard College.

MARK YAXLEY

Marc Yaxley, Classical and Jazz guitarist, holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music from Stetson University. His career has taken him to the movie screen as a featured soloist in Universal Studio's "Ghost Story", and he has performed in various musical settings, from some of Las Vegas's finer resort hotels to the Classical concept stage. During the past 10 years, Marc has performed with two of the world's greatest bass trombone players, Carl Fontanna and Bill Watrous. He has provided Jazz music for private functions held by the London Symphony Orchestra and was recently featured on National Public Radio. His personal educational experience includes private instruction and master classes. Marc is currently head of the Jazz Guitar Department at Western Carolina University.

PAUL BARBER

Paul Barber, trombone soloist, received his Bachelor and Master Degrees in Music from the University of Michigan. Paul retired, June 2003 as Director of Fine Arts for the Farmington (MI) Public Schools. He founded and conducted the Farmington Community Band for 37 years. Upon retirement he joined Brevard Community Band in July, 2003. Paul also performs with several area groups: the Asheville and Hendersonville Community Bands, Pyramid Brass Quintet, Nouveau-Passe Jazz Orchestra, and the Buddy K Big Band Orchestra. Paul is also the Assistant Conductor for the BCB.

Concert Features OOMPAH Band

The Brevard Community Band, Inc. will present its Fall Concert on Sunday, Sept. 28, at 3:30 p.m. in Dunham Hall on the Brevard College campus. The band is under the direction of Dr. David Kirby, band director in the Music Department of Brevard College.

The concert will feature selections by The German OOMPAH Band, composed of members; clarinets-Kathy Young, Fern Barber, Ken McCord and Mary Jane Lang; trumpets-Bill Shank and Gary Keener; trombones-Paul Barber and Ray Dewey; and tuba-Dick Sieber. This group will also be featured on Oct. 11 at the TCarts Oktoberfest Festival. Some of the music by the BCB will include "Summertime" by George and Ira Gershwin, "Georgia On My Mind" by Hoagy Carmichael, selections from the movie "Annie Get Your Gun" by Irving Berlin, and several marches by Sousa and other composers.

The community band is a volunteer organization dedicated to presenting popular and entertaining concert band music to Transylvania's music loving community. This Fall Concert is the second concert presented this year, along with several outdoor concerts, July 4, July 19 and Aug. 9 under the gazebo in downtown Brevard,

and at Relay for Life Walk-A-Thon on Sept. 5.

One of the missions of the band is to attract the youth of the community to attend the concerts. With that in mind, the admission is free to children under the age of 17 when accompanied by an adult. To encourage adults to attend our indoor concerts the admission charge is only \$5 when purchased in advance at either Celestial Mountain Music at 16 West Main Street or Rockin' Robins Records and CD's in College Plaza on North Broad Street across from Brevard College. Adult tickets at the door on the day of the concert will be \$6.

The BCB is a 501 (c) (3) Tax Exempt Public Supported Organization as a North Carolina Corporation. BCB relies on sponsors each concert season to support scholarships to deserving Transylvania High School students as they continue their musical endeavors. This year the BCB was able to award its first scholarship to Brandon Yarns to assist him as he continues his musical education at Arizona State University.
