<u>To Continue Music Studies</u> Yarns Headed To Arizona

Like many seniors, Brevard High salutatorian Brandon Yarns officially finished his public school days earlier this week.

Yarns finished Wednesday. "I was very relieved to finally have it over," said Yarns. "Toward the end, I've been waiting and waiting to get it over, but it was always one more thing."

Not that Yarns didn't enjoy himself while going to classes.

This year he took personal instruction in music theory and conducting from Brevard College professor David Kirby and an independent study AP class in Spanish at Brevard High.

While the course grades might have driven his grade point average down just a bit, Yarns said he wouldn't have done it differently.

"It was a good experience and I wouldn't change any of the stuff I did," Yarns said. "I was really able to focus on what I'm interested in by doing that."

Yarns has been playing clarinet since the sixth grade and has gotten pretty good at it. This summer, he'll be traveling to Goteborg, Sweden, as part of the International Youth Wind Orchestra. The orchestra will be in Sweden

from June 27-July 6. "It's like an all-district band, only bigger," Yarns said in his own good-natured way.

After that, Yarns will go to Salt Lake City to compete in the International Clarinet Association.

Yarns, the son of Robert and Teresa Yarns, qualified as one of six finalists in the national competition. He said judges chose the finalists based on


