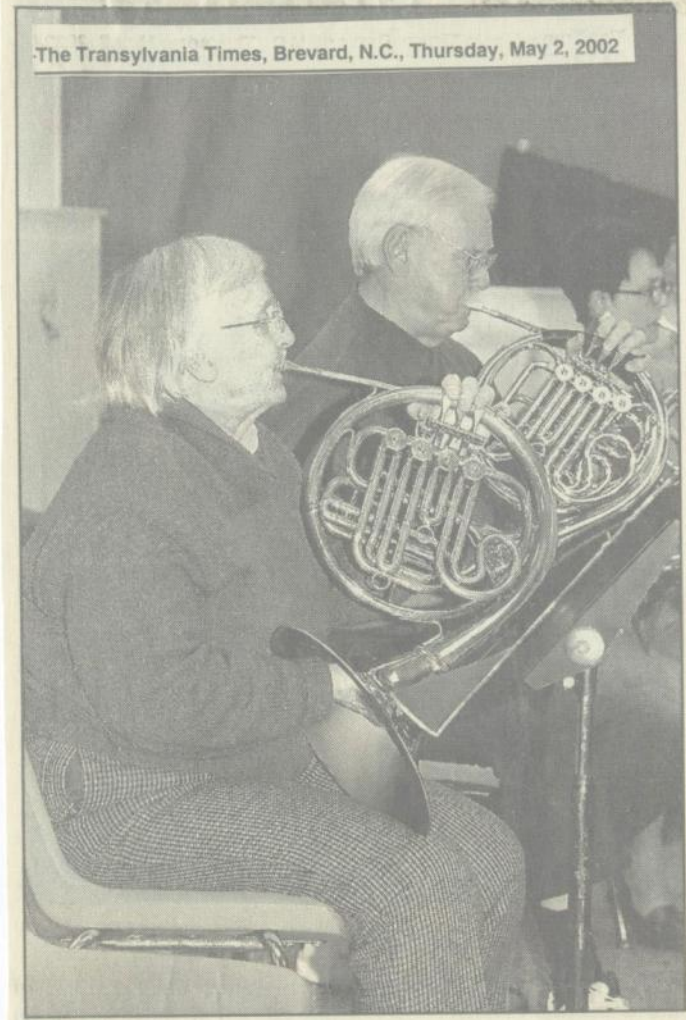

May 10

Band To Give Spring Performance

The Brevard Community Band will present its spring concert Friday, May 10 in the Brevard High School auditorium. The concert, which will start at 7:30 p.m., will offer a spirited and stirring mix of music to enhance the upbeat mood that accompanies the glorious changes of spring in Brevard. The concert date is the same date on which the band had its first rehearsal last year. This spring concert will mark the

sixth performance of the group since that first rehearsal. Presented will be several marches, including "Semper Fidelis," "The Strategic Air Command" and "Nobles of the Mystic Shrine" as well as medleys of popular musical shows such as "Chorus Line" and "Phantom of the Opera." Also a medley of American music, originally arranged for the Canadian Brass and adapted for concert band, should make for some enjoy-

able listening.

A trumpet solo in the "Phantom" will be played by Dr. Bill Shank. He received a doctor of musical arts degree from LSU and has played in several symphony orchestras. For many years he was principal trumpet in the Charleston Symphony and currently is a member of the Asheville, Hendersonville and Spartanburg orchestras. He also has directed bands and choruses.

Rockell Scott has sung to appreciative audiences at all of the band's previous performances and will again grace the stage as soloist for this concert. She will sing "As Time Goes By" and "Embraceable You." She was vocalist for several years with the United States Air Force Band of Mid-America.

The featured artist for the evening will be Dr. David Kirby, director of the band, who will play a clarinet solo titled "Concertino." Kirby is associate professor of music and director of bands at Brevard College. He formerly directed a community band in Lenoir and was Artist in Residence for the National Endowment For The Arts in Dodge City, Kan.before coming to Brevard.


Jim Stokes will direct the band accompaniment for the solo. Stokes, retired director of the Hendersonville High School Band, founded and conducts the Hendersonville Community Band which this year celebrated its 10th year anniversary.

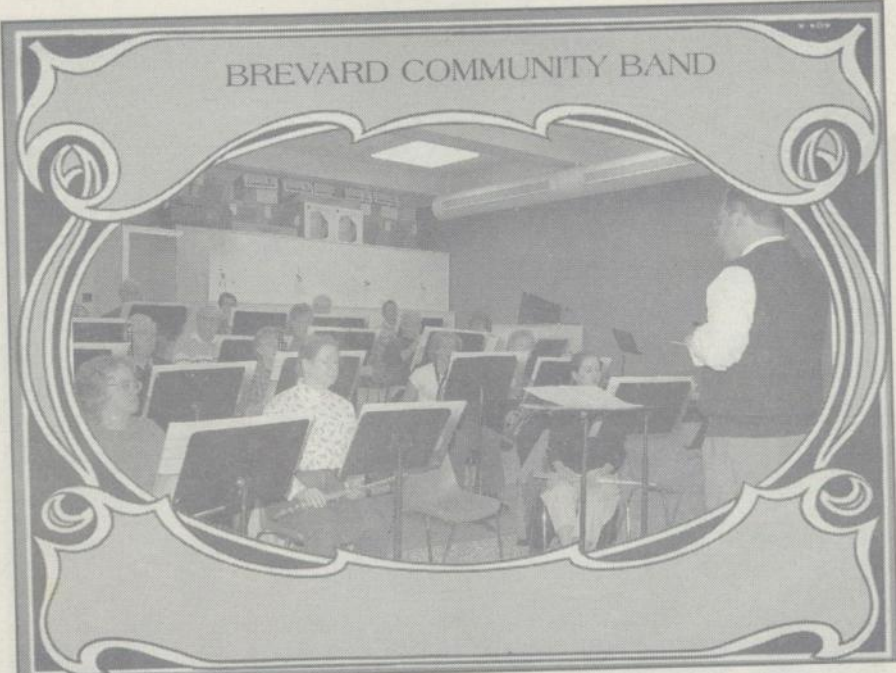

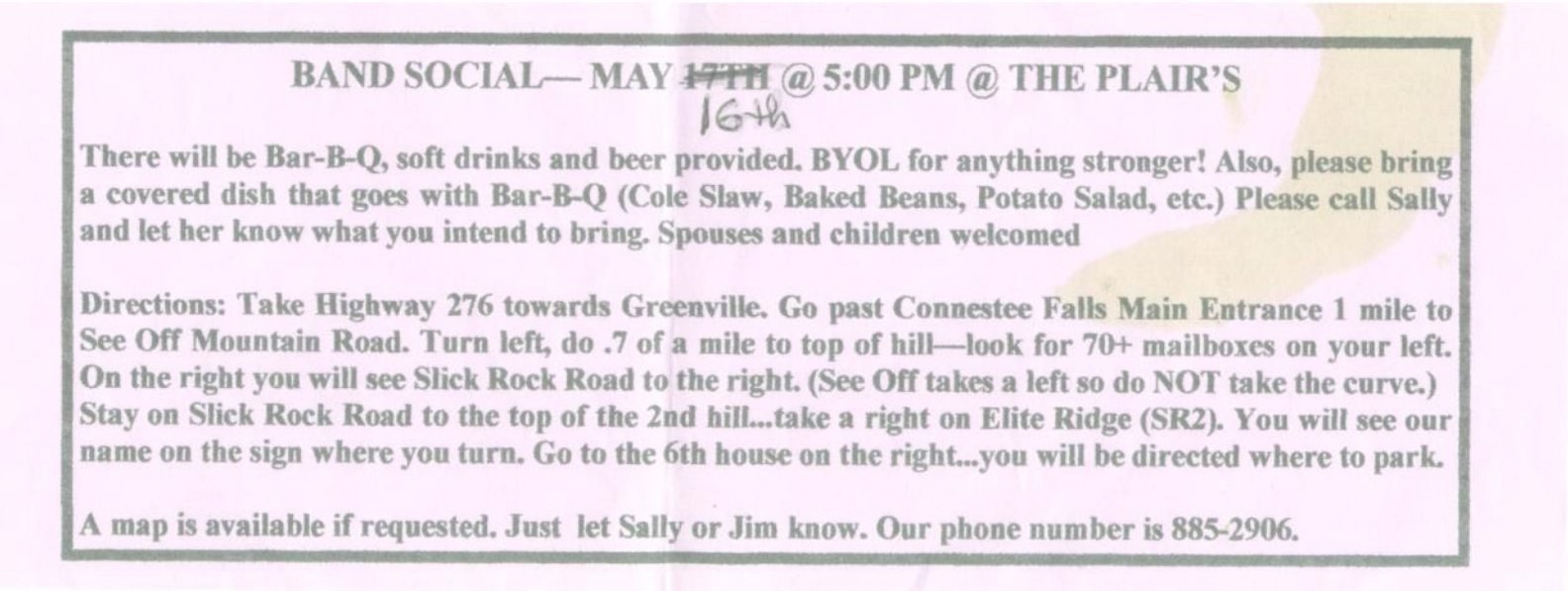

Relay For Life To Feature A Varied Musical Lineup

Walking, talking, strumming, singing: Transylvania County residents will be on stage and on the track at the County Activity Center on Ecusta Road, Friday night, Sept. 6 as Relay for Life 2002 gets underway. The community fundraiser for the American Cancer Society kicks off at 6 p.m. with an opening ceremony featuring the sheriff's Honor Guard and the singing of the National Anthem by local resident, Leon Wall.

Cancer survivors will be honored during their lead-off celebratory walk, followed by participants representing forty teams from around the county. Survivors will be welcomed at a reception before starting their walk.

As team members begin their laps around the track, musical entertainment will be provided by many well known local groups, including the Hogtown Squealers and the

Pisgah Pilgrims, presenting gospel, blue grass and country music. The Brevard Community Band, under the direction of Dr. David Kirby, Brevard College, will take the stage at 8 p.m., leading up to the impressive lighting of thousands of luminaria as darkness descends. The luminaria candles line the track and burn throughout the night as symbols of the fight against cancer. The sound of bagpipes, played by Dr. Ora Wells, will provide the background for prayer and a silent lap around the track as the candles glow.

Additional musical entertainment will feature the Country Grass Unit, with Jim McCarthy and Frank Racheley. Wanda Lu Paxton, songwriter and singer, will be on stage from 9 to 10:30 p.m. Livening up the late evening hours will be the Brevard College Jazz Band, followed by Hope

Hollingsworth, vocalist, and her accompanist, Gary Byrd, who will entertain walkers into early Saturday.

During the wee hours of the morning, walkers will be kept awake by Brevard College hard rock groups and a disc jockey providing much needed eye-opening music. When the sun comes up, John Linville's gospel songs, and the harmony of the Kent Lance Family will end the musical entertainment. The closing ceremony of Relay for Life 2002 will take place at 8 a.m.

The Relay for Life Food Court and teams selling homemade goodies will give walkers the opportunity to chow down and get energized for another lap around the track throughout Friday evening. Saturday morning, the Brevard Rotary will be on hand to serve breakfast. Two bingo sessions will be called Friday evening and there will be activities for children.

Community Band To Present Concert Next Month At BHS

The Brevard Community Band, Inc., will present its fall concert on Oct. 5 at the Brevard High School Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. The band is under the direction of Dr. David Kirby, band director in the music department of Brevard College.

Recent appearances by the band were the Fourth of July at the Gazebo on Main Street, the Relay for Life event of Sept. 6, and the remembrance ceremony on Sept. 11.

The band members come

not only from Brevard but also from the Hendersonville and Asheville area. They range in ages from high school students to retirees who have a common goal of providing the best band concert music to our community. This includes stirring marches, show and movie tunes and light classical music.

Music to be played at the fall concert includes "King Cotton March" by Sousa, "Paris Mountain Overture" by Andrew Balent, "Home Stretch" by Leroy Anderson,

"New York: 1927" by Warren Barker, and "How Long Has This Been Going On" by George and Ira Gershwin and sung by Brevard's own Rockell Scott-Whiteside.

Tickets will be available at Celestial Mountain Music at 16 West Main Street, Rockin' Robins Records and CD at 17 South Broad Street. Advance admission is \$5 or \$6 at the door for adults and children under age 17 are admitted free with an adult.

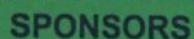

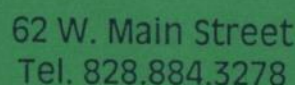

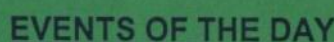

Watch Out For Those White Squirrels!

Each fall, Bob Glesener coordinates the annual white squirrel count.

Yes, they do exist, and Glesener, the director of The White Squirrel Research Institute, will conduct his 12th yearly survey of the creatures.

The study area is roughly 3 square miles following the original city limits.

According to the survey, the white squirrel makes up about 25 percent of the entire local squirrel population.

The Brevard College campus has been found to have the highest density of white squirrels and is the best place to see the little creatures.

Brevard's white squirrels are not albinos but brown-eyed creatures.

Brevard College researchers found that the lack of pigment is caused by a recessive genetic defect.

Brevard, locals say, is now the "Home of the White Squirrel," but at least eight towns, including Olney, Ill., Kenton, Tenn., and Greenwood, S.C.,

in the United States claim them also.

There has also been reports that the squirrels have begun to be spotted in next door Henderson County, but jealousy could be a factor in those sightings.

In 1986, the Brevard City Council approved an ordinance protecting the creatures, and the city hosts a yearly festival named after the animal.

The Fifth Annual White Squirrel Festival will be held this May 24-25 and includes many white-squirrel themed attractions, including a photo contest, squirrel box derby and chances for photographs with Pisgah Pete.

One opportunity to help protect the little critters is to "adopt" a white squirrel.

For \$25 a year, one receives a "Certificate of Adoption," a photo and two letters per year from the squirrel.

The story of how white squirrels arrived in Brevard has entered leg-

endary status.

Local resident Barbara Mull Lang remembers when she was 10 years old, several decades ago, that her uncle visited Brevard and brought with him two white squirrels.

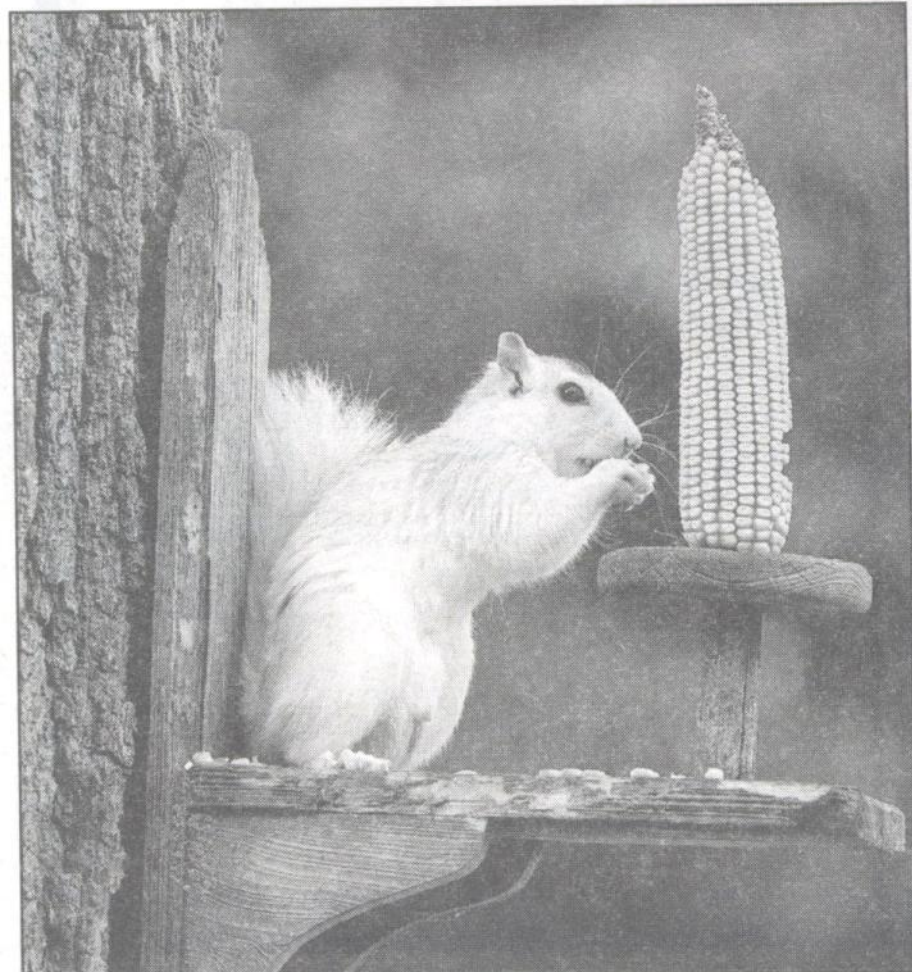
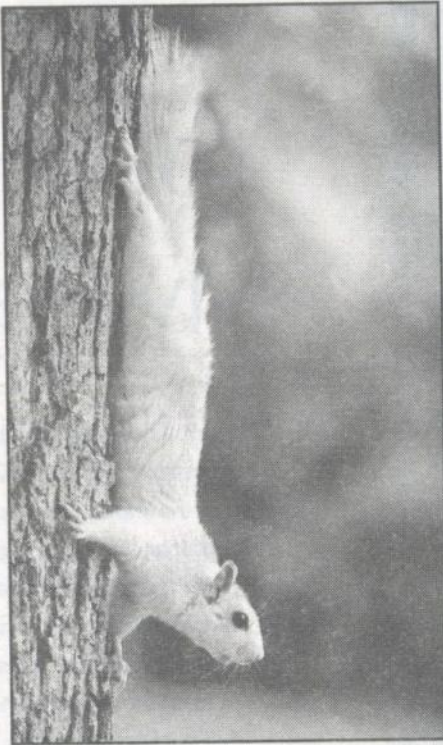
A certain M.M. Black gave her uncle the squirrels after he helped to catch them in Black's pecan grove.

The animals had apparently escaped from a carnival truck.

Lang said she took care of the squirrels and later left them with her grandfather when her family moved away from Brevard.

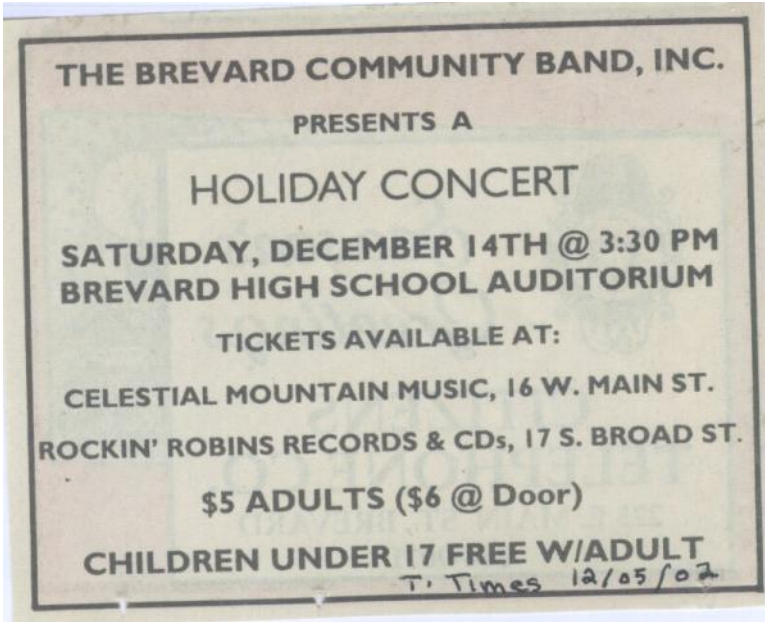

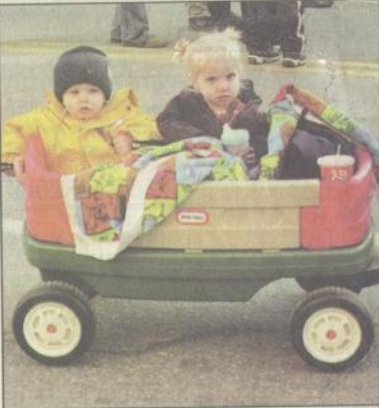
