# Bud Tucker, founder, obituary

## Dr. Walter E. "Bud" Tucker, Jr.

Dr. Walter E. "Bud" Tucker, Jr., 74, of Brevard, died Monday, March 20, 2006 at Transylvania Community Hospital.

Born in Atlanta, Ga., he was the son of the late Walter E. Tucker, Sr. and Eva L. Tucker.

Dr. Tucker had lived in Bre vard since 1993 after his retirement from Burroughs Wellcome (the main subsidiary of a British International pharmaceutical company). He was a pharmaceutical research scientist for 30 years and was Vice President, Toxicology and Pathology at retirement. He led research teams in the study of the toxicological potential of candidate drugs under development. Information from these studies, done in animals, were vital to the selection of drugs for clinical trials in people.

During his career he and his colleagues played a major role in the development of important drugs; among these was Acylovir, the first aniviral drug to be widely used in man. This was an important scientific and medical advance which opened the door to the development of other aniviral agents by various research groups

He obtained primary schooling in Atlanta, Ga., attended Emory University and was a graduate from the University of Georgia School of Veterinary Medicine. He did post graduate work at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology where he and another veterinarian were the first to enter a new program to train veterinarians in pathology. At the end of four years as resident and staff member he became a Diplomate of The American College of Veterinary Pathology. Dr. Tucker was a member of several national scientific groups and published articles in variety of scientific and clinical medical journals.
"Bud", as he preferred to be known, was a very active amateur musician and, after his family, music clearly was his main interest during his retirement. He was a keyboardist, tenor soloist, and french hornist. Along with several others he started the Brevard Community Band. He played the french horn in that band as well as the Hendersonville Community band, and an orchestra as well.

Survivors include his wife, Betty Sue Gorman Tucker; his three beloved daughters, Kimberly Lynn Tucker Corn and husband, Jeff of Brevard, Lynda Kay Tucker of Atlanta, Ga., and Beck Eva Tucker White and husband, Christopher of Atlanta, Ga.; and his four grandchildren, Scott Berry, Steven Berry, Austin Corn, and Eva Marie White.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, April 15, 2006 at Connestee Falls Club House in Brevard.

# DIRECTIONS TO MEADOW RIDGE @ LAKE TOXAWAY 

From the Brevard County Courthouse (where the Gazebo is) on Highway 64 West, it is approximately 24 miles to the Main Entrance to the Lake Toxaway Estates. Take a lught at this entrance to Lake Toxaway Estates. You will be on West Club Boulevard as you enter the Main Entrance. West Club Boulevard circles the lake, and it will take a 90degree turn to the right, BUT you will continue on straight, which will put you on Chestnut Trace. Continue until you come to a dead end, and turn left onto Fairway Drive. You will almost immediately come to a fork. You will take the left fork onto Toxaway Drive. Remain on Toxaway Drive - it is very steep and very curvy - until you get to Panthertown Road. Turn left onto Panthertown Road and look for the parking area and the Pavilion where we will be playing. It will be easy to get confused IF you do not look for the MEADOW RIDGE direction signs all along the way. If you do this you should be OK. I will attempt to sketch a map to help you understand these directions. From the Main Gate it is about 6 miles up to Meadow Ridge, elevation 4,280 feet

Copper (White) Ferreira, is a clarinetist whose professional career has taken her across the United States and beyond. While completing her undergraduate degree at Brevard College, Copper held the principal clarinet position in the BC Symphonic Winds and served as assistant principal clarinet position with the Brevard Chamber Orchestra for the 2002-2003 season. She also attended the prestigious Brevard Music Center festival. In 2005, she made her international debut at the Xi'an International Clarinet and Saxophone festival in Xi'an, China. She currently serves as principal clarinetist with the Stratford [Ontario] Civic Orchestra.

Copper completed a Master of Music degree in clarinet performance at Arizona State University in 2005 and recently completed a second Master of Music degree in Music Theory at the University of Western Ontario. This past year Copper accepted a part-time position in the theory department at Mount Allison University in Sackville, New Brunswick. While in Eastern Canada, she has also performed with the Prince Edward Island Symphony Orchestra, the opera orchestra of Université de Moncton, and the newly formed Atlantic Wind Orchestra based in Halifax, Nova Scotia. She has served as the musical director for several community theaters and will serve as the musical director for the Festival by the Marsh in the summer of 2008.
