May 2023 was one of the busiest spring months to date for WTWMA operations. A total of 10 operational days were conducted with 29.9 hours of flight time. Overall, 381 glaciogenic flares and 28 hygroscopic flares were used within all counties of the target area. Several factors were in play for the busy month. First, the transition season tends to be busier due to dryline development. Second, the dissipation of La Nina allowed the atmosphere to respond providing more normal conditions. Lastly, a blocking pattern set up which put southwesterly flow aloft over the region for a prolonged amount of time. All these factors led to numerous rounds of showers and storms which resulted in the busy month. On top of the 10 operational days, the area also experienced 3 overnight rain events which also added to the rainfall data for the month.

San Angelo's 4.19" in May exceeded the average of 3.05" for the month. This takes the year-to-date rainfall to 6.42", still falling behind the year-to-date average of 8.12". Midland and Abilene both exceeded their monthly average with only Abilene above their year-to-date average. However, numerous stations across the target area saw higher totals. Most areas in Crockett County exceeded 4" for the month, while Sutton and Schleicher Counties saw totals in the 3-6" range. Irion and Sterling County pushed in the 3.5-5" range as well. Though convective activity could be spotty at times, larger overnight events tried to smooth totals out.

Looking ahead into June, El Nino has officially been declared. However, the atmosphere seems to be calming down some after such a busy May. The first few weeks of June look hot, and primarily dry, though long-range models do hint at the normal diurnal convection we can expected in the peak of the summer.
