

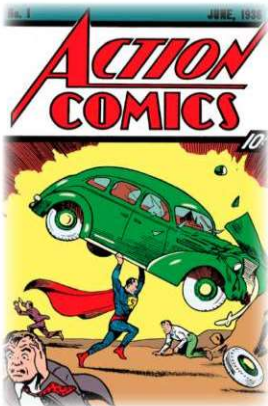

1939 – Joe Shuster from Toronto published his first *Superman* comic strip. Shuster made the drawings, and his partner, Jerry Siegel, did the writing. Employed by DC-National, the pair produced the lead feature in the company’s first issue of *Action Comics* in 1939. Superman, the



feature character in that issue, adhered to a strict moral code and was an enormous success that led to what is referred to as the “Golden Age of Comic Books.”
