1889 – The first jukebox made its debut in San Francisco at the Palais Royale Saloon. Invented by Louis Glass, it was first called the nickel-in-the-slot player.

Harpo Marx (1888–1964) was an American visual comedian, actor, and mime artist known for his silent but hilarious performances. The second oldest of the famed Marx Brothers, his comedic style drew on vaudeville, clown, and pantomime traditions. Rather than speaking in his films, he used expression, blowing a horn, or whistling to get his meaning across. Marx, who dropped out of school at age eight, often used props and wore a curly wig in his performances. Some of his films include *The Cocoanuts*, *A Night in Casablanca*, and *Animal Crackers*.
