I was a movie star and a successful singer and my career spanned almost 70 years.

In 1952 I worked with Gene Kelly in the movie Singin' in The Rain. As a singer I had several hits including Tammy.

I was married to Eddie Fisher, and we had two children. My daughter was an accomplished actress and author. She was best known for playing Princess Leia in the Star Wars film franchise and for her bestselling book Postcards from the Edge.

I was an American actor and film director with a career spanning 60 years. I gained notoriety in 1951 when I played Stanley Kowalski in Tennessee Williams' A Streetcar Named Desire.

I portrayed many historical figures including Julius Caesar, Emiliano Zapata, and Mark Anthony.


In 1972 I played Vito Corleone in the film The Godfather.

According to the Guinness Book of Records, I was paid a record USD\$3.7 million (16 million in today's inflation-adjusted dollars) for 13 days of work in the movie Superman.

In 1999, Time magazine named me 'Actor of the Century'.

I had 11 children.

### **3rd of April 1922**

I was an American singer and actress. I recorded more than 650 songs between 1947 and 1967. I am from German stock; both my paternal and maternal grandparents were German.

In 1947 I recorded Sentimental Journey which would soon become an anthem. Then, even though I had no experience in acting, I was offered a role in Romance on the High Seas. This was followed by I'll See You in My Dreams which broke box-office records.

I worked with some top billing actors such as James Gagney, Rock Hudson, James Stewart, and Louis Jourdan.

In the movie The Man Who Knew Too Much I sang Que Sera, Sera which won an Academy Award for best original song.

I am an American actor, born and raised in New York city.


I was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor for my second film Friendly Persuasion with also starred Gary Cooper.

## 5th of April 1908

I am regarded as one of the greatest actresses in Hollywood history. I won an Academy Award for Best Actress for my role in Jezebel, the first of 5 consecutive years of Best Actress nominations.

Some of my memorable movies include: All About Eve and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf ?.

I married three times and raised three children; one biological and 2 adopted. My relationship with my eldest daughter soured when she wrote a tell-all book in 1985 about her recollections of her childhood.

## 10th of April 1932


I was an actor of Lebanese descent but I was born and raised in Egypt. My father was a wealthy timber merchant but I had my eyes on a film career.

I started my career in Egypt where I became very popular. I moved to Hollywood in the early 1960s and landed a role in the movie Lawrence of Arabia - after it was offered to three other actors and they all declined.

The movie was tremendously successful and I became well known.

Two years later in 1965 I landed another role in a movie that became a huge hit; Dr. Zhivago.

## 14th of April 1940

I am a British actress (born in India) of the “Swinging London” era of the 1960s.

My career breakthrough came in 1963 with a role in Billy Liar.

I came to international attention for my performances in Darling (1965) for which I won the Academy Award for Best Actress and Doctor Zhivago (also 1965), the eighth highest-grossing film of all time after adjustment for inflation.

I also starred in Far From the Madding Crowd, Fahrenheit 451, Don't Look Now, and Heaven Can Wait.

I dated Terence Stamp and Warren Beatty before marrying my current husband in the early 1970s. We are still together.

## 18th of April 1946

I am British and I began my acting career as a child. My father was also a well-known actor.

When I was 12, I discovered that the director of the movie my father was starring in was looking for a boy to play the lead role in the film. Despite being a girl, I auditioned and won the role in Tiger Bay.

The following year one of Walt Disney's producers saw Tiger Bay and suggested me for the lead role in Pollyanna. I won the role and received a special Academy Award for my performance.

Other memorable movies I made include: The Trouble with Angels and The Family Trap (and its sequel).

## **19th of pril 1933**

I was an American film, theatre, and television star. My career only began after I married and had my first child at 17 years old of age.

I became one of the original Playboy Playmates in 1955, aged 22.

The same year, I signed a 6 year contract with Twenty Century Fox. My first movie This Girl Can't Help It became one of the year's biggest successes. In 1957, I won a Golden Globe for 'New Star of the Year' beating Carol Baker and Natalie Wood.

I was called the "Blond Bombshell".

I married 3 times and had five children. I was killed in a car accident aged 34.

## 21st of April 1915

I was a Mexican-American actor, painter, writer and film director. I was born in Chihuahua, Mexico but raised in Texas and Los Angeles.

I was a professional boxer as a young man before being drawn to acting.

The breakthrough of my career came in 1936 with the film *Blood & Sand* opposite Rita Hayworth and Tyrone Power. I also did stage work, replacing Marlon Brando in *A Streetcar Named Desire* on Broadway.

Some of my most memorable movies are *Viva Zapata!*, *High Noon*, *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*, *Attila the Hun*, and *La Strada* with Dino De Laurentiis.

I was awarded an Oscar for my portrayal of Paul Gauguin in Vincent Minnelli's film *Lust for Life*. In 1964, I had a smash-hit success with *Zorba, The Greek*.

## 23rd of April 1928

I was an American actress, singer, dancer, and diplomat.

I was three years old when I was spotted by a Hollywood casting director in a dancing studio. My mother signed a contract with 20th Century Fox.

From 1935 to 1940, I was the number one box-office child star in Hollywood. Some of my movies were: On The Good Ship Lollipop, Animal Crackers, The Littlest Rebel, Poor Little Rich Girl, Heidi, and Dimples among many more.

After I retired, I became Ambassador for Czechoslovakia and Ghana.
