1830 – In Fayette Township, New York, Joseph Smith, founder of the Mormon religion, organized the church during a meeting with a small group of believers.



1896 – Male athletes from across Europe and the United States gathered in Athens, Greece, to participate in the first modern Olympic Games. The original games had been banned 1,500 years earlier by the Roman emperor Theodosius I in his effort to abolish paganism.

1917 – The United States entered World War I.
