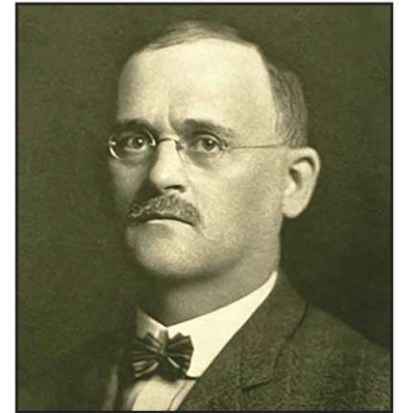

2. *Playboy*. The first issue of *Playboy* debuted in December of 1953 with Marilyn Monroe on the cover.
3. True. The other April birth flower is the daisy.
4. (C) Poland. Representatives from Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Great Britain, Iceland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, and the United States signed the initial NATO agreement. Today, 30 countries are a part of NATO.
5. (D) Cheerios. Cheerios is a General Mills cereal.
6. "Flowers that bloom in May." The song's title is "April Showers," and Al Jolson first performed it in the Broadway musical *Bombo* in 1921.

11. (D) Canada. Mary Pickford was born in Toronto, Ontario.
12. True. Paul Revere's famous ride took place on April 18, 1775.
13. The diamond. The Gemological Institute of America's founder, Robert M. Shipley, developed this grading system to determine diamond quality in the 1940s.
14. (E) All of the above. Willie Nelson has written many songs from a wide variety of genres, including country, jazz, pop, R&B, and folk.
15. (D) The Jewish people's deliverance from slavery in Egypt. Passover is one of the three pilgrim festivals. The other two are Shavuot and Sukkot.
