1583 – Explorer Sir Humphrey Gilbert founded the first English colony in North America, near Saint John's, Newfoundland. The colonists were mutinous, however,



and the expedition quickly returned to England. Gilbert's personal motto was "*Quid non?*" ("Why not?")

1858 – The first transatlantic telegraph cable was laid from Ireland to Newfoundland.

1928 – Bobbie Rosenfeld, Jane Bell, Ethel Smith, and Myrtle Cook won Olympic Gold in the 4x100 relay.

In addition to winning the 4x100 relay at the 1928 Olympics in Amsterdam, Team Canada, which numbered 92 athletes, captured three other gold medals. Percy Williams won both the 100- and 200-meter races, and Ethel Catherwood won the high jump.
