1878 – In New York, milk was delivered for the first time in glass bottles. Up to that time, the milkman had ladled it out of his container directly into the customer’s container.



1922 – At Toronto General Hospital, 14-year-old Leonard Thompson became the first person to receive an insulin injection as treatment for diabetes. His condition improved dramatically, and pharmaceutical companies were given the license to produce the remedy free of royalties. By 1923, insulin had become widely available, saving countless lives around the world.

Carroll Shelby (1923–2012) was a legendary automotive designer, racing driver, and entrepreneur. He is best known for his involvement with the



Ford Motor Company, developing the AC Cobra and Mustang, which came to be known as Shelby Mustangs. Shelby had

an exceptional racing career, setting 16 speed records and winning the 1959 24 Hours of Le Mans, becoming just the second American to do so. He was named *Sports Illustrated*’s driver of the year in 1956 and 1957. He retired from driving in 1959.
