Quincy Jones, born in 1933, is a bona fide American music and entertainment legend. A brilliant musician, composer, conductor, and arranger, Jones worked with greats including Dizzy Gillespie, Frank Sinatra, Sarah Vaughan, Ella Fitzgerald, and Ray Charles. And that was just the start! Jones also found success as a film and record producer. Among his many credits, he produced Michael Jackson's first album, *Off the Wall* (1982), followed



by the highest-selling album of all time, *Thriller* (1985), and *Bad* (1987). Jones has been married three times and has seven children. He has won an astounding 28 Grammy Awards and received Kennedy Center Honors in 2001.
