## On This Date

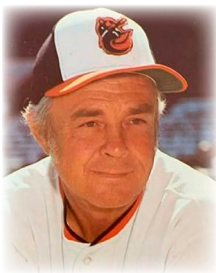
**1612** – English explorer Thomas Button sailed into Hudson Bay and discovered the Nelson River. He also explored what became the New North Wales and New South Wales regions of today's Manitoba.

**1910** – President William Howard Taft began a sports tradition by throwing out the first baseball of the season at an American League game between Washington and Philadelphia. Washington won 3–0.

**1960** – The musical *Bye Bye Birdie* opened at the Martin Beck Theatre in New York City. Chita Rivera and Dick Van Dyke starred in the Broadway show, which ran for 607 performances.

**Valerie Hobson** (1917–1998) was a British actress who was born in



Larne, Ireland. As a girl, she traveled to London frequently for dance and theater lessons and made her stage and screen debuts while still a

teen. Some of her most prominent roles include starring as Baroness Frankenstein in the iconic 1935 horror film *Bride of Frankenstein*, as Estella in *Great Expectations* with John Mills, and as Edith D'Ascoyne in *Kind Hearts and Coronets* with John Guinness. Hobson also starred in *Werewolf of London* and in the London stage production of *The King and I*.
