1612 – English explorer Thomas Button sailed into Hudson Bay and discovered the Nelson River. He also explored what became the New North Wales and New South Wales regions of today's Manitoba.

**1910** – President William Howard Taft began a sports tradition by throwing out the first baseball of the season at an American League game between Washington and Philadelphia. Washington won 3–0.

**1960** – The musical *Bye Bye Birdie* opened at the Martin Beck Theatre in New York City. Chita Rivera and Dick Van Dyke starred in the Broadway show, which ran for 607 performances.

Hobson also starred in Werewolf of London and in the London stage production of The King and I.
