1914 – A Serbian nationalist assassinated Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife in Sarajevo, Bosnia, which had been annexed into the Austro-Hungarian empire. The sequence of events that ensued led to the outbreak of World War I several months later.

1958 – The Mackinac Bridge, the world’s longest suspension bridge at the time, was dedicated. Ceremonies began with the “Governor’s Walk” across the bridge. The bridge joined the upper and lower peninsulas of the state of Michigan, reducing the crossing time from a couple of hours to just 10 minutes.
