1866 – Pierre Lallement received a patent for the first true bicycle with a transmission consisting of a rotary crank mechanism and pedals.



This replaced the pushbike that was propelled when the rider pushed it along with their feet while steering the front wheel.

1962 – The United States lifted its blockade of Cuba and began moving warships away from the island, marking the close of the Cuban Missile Crisis. The Soviet Union had removed its missiles from Cuba earlier that month.

1992 – In England, a fire broke out in Windsor Castle, causing serious damage. Four days later, Queen Elizabeth II would describe 1992 as *annus horribilis*—“horrible year.”
