Leonhard Euler (1707–1783) was a groundbreaking Swiss mathematician, logician, physicist, geographer, and astronomer. The polymath, who was born in Basel, Switzerland, has been called "one of the greatest mathematicians of all time." Euler made prolific contributions to the fields of math, astronomy, and in calculus, physics, including number theory, trigonometry, analytic geometry, graph theory,



and topography. Amazingly, despite losing his sight at age 64, he continued to produce important mathematical work.
