**Lloyd Augustus Hall** (1894–1971) was a pioneering American chemist and inventor from Elgin, Illinois. His innovative work focused on food preservation. Before his inventions, the techniques used to keep food edible over time centered mostly on using salts and other methods that detracted from the taste of the foods and were not always very effective at preventing spoilage. Hall developed methods, many of which are still in use today, that preserved foods while also maintaining flavor. His work received 59 U.S. patents.
