1958 – Nikita Khrushchev became the prime minister of the Soviet Union. An impulsive leader, he became notorious for his saberrattling rhetoric. Within the Soviet



Union, Khrushchev tried to humanize the system by releasing waves of political prisoners from the Gulag, a network of forcedlabor camps.
