1784 – The Second Treaty of Paris was ratified by Congress to officially end the Revolutionary War. This pact came more than two years after the American and French victory at Yorktown, the last major battle of the war.

1954 – Marilyn Monroe married baseball great Joe DiMaggio. It was the culmination of a courtship that had captivated the nation. Unfortunately, the marriage lasted only nine months.

1968 – An ice storm fatally damaged the silver maple at 62 Laing Street, Toronto, Ontario. It was this tree that had inspired Alexander Muir to write the 1867 song “The Maple Leaf Forever.”
