Ian Fleming (1908–1964) was a British author best remembered for his *James Bond* series of spy novels and for the children’s classic *Chitty-Chitty-Bang-Bang*. Fleming wintered in Jamaica for almost two decades, and that is where he wrote much of the *James Bond* series. The writer served with distinction as a British Naval Intelligence Commander during World War II, and this provided the background for his writing. Fleming and his wife, Ann Charteris, had one son, Casper. The most recent James Bond feature film, *No Time to Die*, was released in April 2020.
