On This Date

1833 – In the last fatal duel in Ontario, John Wilson killed Robert Lyon. The two law students and former friends had quarreled over remarks made by Lyon about Elizabeth Hughes, a local teacher. Wilson was acquitted of murder, married Hughes, and became an MP and judge.

1886 – Fire wiped out much of the city of Vancouver, destroying nearly 1,000 buildings and killing 28 people. The new service of the Canadian Pacific Railroad brought emergency supplies and facilitated rebuilding efforts.

1900 – China’s Boxer Rebellion against foreigners and Christians erupted into violence. Many of the rebels practiced martial arts, hence the name “Boxer.”

Artist Andy Warhol became famous for his painting of Campbell’s soup cans. Before that, he made his living painting shoes for ads.



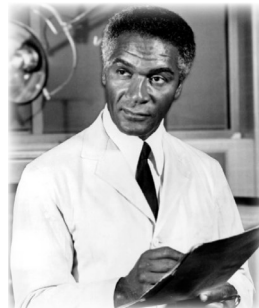

Percy Rodriguez (1918–2007) was a Canadian actor who appeared in many television shows and films from the 1950s to the 1980s. In 1960, he made his Broadway theater debut in Lillian Hellman’s *Toys in the Attic*. His breakthrough role came in 1968 as neurosurgeon Dr. Harry Miles in the prime-time soap opera *Peyton Place*. His deep, commanding voice



helped Rodriguez to be frequently cast as intelligent authority figures. He and his first wife, Alameda, had a daughter and a son.
