Salvador Dalí (1904–1989) was a groundbreaking Spanish-Catalan surrealist painter. The influential artist had a colorful and imposing presence with his long cape, walking stick, haughty expression, and upturned waxed mustache that often drew as much attention as his innovative artwork. Highly imaginative and productive, Dalí



produced over 1,500 paintings during his career. The largest collection in North America is housed at the Salvador Dalí Museum located in

St. Petersburg, Florida.
