Our Midwinter convention is also going Virtual this year. No cost to attend. The date is Saturday February 13, 2021. It will go from 9 am until loosely 12ish. If technology does not fail us there will be a Facebook Live Streaming off of the 5M2 Facebook Page. Also there will be a link to Zoom and we are currently working on putting all of this information onto our District Website. So in a nutshell we had a FANTASTIC hybrid convention all in place. I hope everyone will attend this years Mid-Winter. I even have heard there may be a few delegate parties for the business meeting.



#### Introducing our International Director attending the 5M2 Mid-Winter Convention



#### DR. JOSÉ A. MARRERO INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Dr, José A. Marrero, from Arecibo, Puerto Rico, USA was elected to serve as international director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 102nd International Convention, held in Milan, Italy, July 5 through July 9, 2019.

Director Marrero has been a physician for 39 years and is currently medical director for a community care clinic with emergency care, lab and X-ray facilities. His clinic is the primary care provider to most of the population within the surrounding areas. Dr. Marrero also works as an emergency physician for a third-level medical facility which receives referrals from all medical facilities and hospitals within the Arecibo district.

He became a Lion when he joined the Arecibo Capitan Correa Lions Club in 1996. Director Marrero has held a number of offices within the association including multiple district Diabetes Awareness and Action chairperson, multiple district GLT coordinator and recently, multiple district GST coordinator. He has served as a presenter in five Regional Leadership Institutes and three USA/Canada Forums. Director Marrero has also served as a member of several International Convention Election committees.

In recognition of his service, Director Marrero has received 11 International President's Certificates, one International President's Leadership Award and two International President's Awards. Director Marrero and his wife, Annie, are both Progressive Melvin Jones Fellows.

Director Marrero also supports an outreach program to the homeless population within Arecibo. Established by his son and the Arecibo Capitan Correa Lions Club, the program provides food, clothing and medical care to people in need. Director Marrero has served as president of his local chapter of the Puerto Rico College of Physicians and as a former city councilperson to the city of Arecibo.

Outside of his Lions and professional responsibilities, Director Marrero pursues an interest in botany and grows tropical bonsais and orchids in his home.

Fellow Lions,

Below is an excerpt from a recent message from LCIF Chair PIP Gudrun Yngvadottir.

Just eight months after a large earthquake struck Croatia's capital in March 2020, another, more powerful quake struck the area, killing at least seven people and injuring dozens more. The December 29 6.4 magnitude quake destroyed several cities and dozens of villages in Sisak-Moslavina County.

When a humanitarian crisis of this magnitude strikes, we, as Lions and humanitarians, are <u>ready to help</u>. Our global foundation, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), quickly responded and approved US\$10,000 in Emergency grant funding to allow Lions in Croatia to respond to urgent needs of the victims.

As enormous challenges due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) persist, so too do natural disasters. LCIF continues to support recovery efforts from natural disasters worldwide, providing Emergency grant funding when and where it is needed.

In November and December 2020 alone, and adding to relief funding for Sisak-Moslavina County, LCIF provided US\$235,000 in Emergency grants for:

- Flood relief in India, Brazil, Italy, and Sri Lanka
- Tropical storm relief in Colombia
- Typhoon relief in the Philippines
- Earthquake relief in Greece


Another change will be online only voting for any voting

#### Dear Lion Leader,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care.

To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors unanimously passed another resolution to help our clubs.

Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

- Charter and entrance fees waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.
- Flexible payments No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 30, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.
  - Please note that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

#### Dear Lion Leader,

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- Everyone's invited Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration fees The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- Current registrants Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- Elections Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- Convention updates Check our convention website <u>LCICon</u> for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time for our organization and the world, and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.

#### FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

The first LIONS DAY AT FMSC that we organized was held at all 3 FMSC locations on March 26, 2018. There were a total of 11 packing sessions with 484 Lions, Leos and Lioness and family and friends of Lions participating out of a total of 1,339 total volunteers. There was a total of 1,503 boxes that were packed which was a total of 324,648 meals! This fed 889 kids for a year! The amount of donations was \$13,526.55.

The second LIONS DAY AT FMSC that we organized was held at all 3 FMSC locations on April 15, 2019. There were a total of 10 packing sessions with 605 Lions, Leos and Lioness and family and friends of Lions participating out of a total of 875 volunteers. There was a total of 888 boxes that were packed which was a total of 191,808 meals! This fed 525 kids for a year! The amount of donations was \$19,961.

Our third LION'S DAY AT FMSC that we organized was originally scheduled for April 20, 2020. With the COVID-19 pandemic, we decided to postpone the event and rescheduled for October 20, 2020. Little did we know the pandemic was still here AND on that date, we also had a SNOWSTORM!! There were a total of 9 packing sessions with 118 Lions, Leos and Lioness and family and friends of Lions participating out of a total of 183 volunteers. There was a total of 323 boxes that were packed which was a total of 69,768 meals! This will feed 191 kids for a year! The amount of donations was \$15,350.

As of today, the pandemic is still here!! MANY challenges and changes have occurred at Feed My Starving Children as they work around the pandemic restrictions to be able to continue to feed the starving children throughout the world!! MANY challenges and changes have also come to Lions and to Lions Clubs!!

With ALL of these changes, we are NOT planning another LION'S DAY AT FMSC. The efforts on our part as co-chairman have included hundreds of hours each year to plan, organize, and carry-out successful LION'S DAYS.

We feel that each Lion and Leo can personally go to FMSC by themselves or with family and pack food. We also feel that Lions Clubs and Leo Clubs can plan their own time during the year to go to FMSC and pack food.

Monetary donations can be made ANYTIME during the year by individuals, Lions clubs or businesses! Especially now during the pandemic, the NEED is greater than ever before!! Please feel free to go on their site at: www.fmsc. org and read the stories and get updates and information!

The Lions Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation expresses its gratitude to and honors individuals through the Lions Hearing Research Fellowship Award. A great deal of valuable research is carried out at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These awards come from the donations of clubs through the 5M9 district projects. For every \$1000 cumulated (per club), an award can be given to an individual, business or group who the club designates. The award may be given to a Lion, but does not have to be so.

The club decides and then sends in an application to the Minnesota Hearing Foundation treasurer, whose information is listed on the form. The form must include the club applying for the award, the name or names of the recipient(s) and the address of the recipient(s). The club will receive the plaque and can then decide when to give it to the award winner.

The plaque is a lovely tribute for service to others, especially in the field of hearing health. Over the next few months, we will be describing several of the research grants that have been given out this year. We are sure you will find some of them interesting and informative.


#### Jordaness Lions




