Viewing Forward



MN Lions Vision Foundation

Gifts of life – this is my appreciation after hearing Saturday seminars at Midwinter. Topics included childhood cancer, diabetes medical breakthroughs, and vision care were the three health issues covered. Expanding on the vision topics, we were honored to hear from three leaders at Lions Gift of Sight. Lion Jennifer Marshall, communications manager, presented a history of our eye bank. Lion Sung Lee addressed the ins and outs of cornea needs for transplants and research. Lion Sean Poppoff brought us up to speed on the "eye bank competition topic. A paragraph for each:

Happy 60th Anniversary, Lions Gift of Sight! For six decades, Minnesota Lions have had 20/20 vision and we use our best resources to maintain our vision into the future! From that first year when MN Lions voted to donate \$6,400 (\$1.00 for each Lion in the state) to the University of Minnesota's Department of Ophthalmology, we have had goals and have succeeded in bringing the best eye care possible to our citizens and the world. As the Lion symbol represents –looking back on a great legacy and looking forward to future successes and goals.

Eye globe donations are gifts in two ways. Corneal transplants are the benefits to individuals and the quality of life to each recipient and all in his/her life circle. Research needs are met by whole eye donations to our research staff and researcher throughout our country and around the globe. All types of research being done

to improve eye care in both developed and undeveloped countries which have different needs. Do you know that our eye bank, Lions Gift of Sight, is rated as one of the top five eye banks in the United States? And this could only happen because of the investment of our MN Lions – pretty fantastic, huh?

And, thirdly, we are informed that there is finally, as of early February, progress via negotiations between Lions Gift of Sight and our competitor SightFirst/Cornea Gen. Last year we pushed diligently to pass legislation eliminating the transfer of tissue for profit. Not accomplished due to legislative hang ups. This year we, with the assistance of greater powers at the University, there will be "at the table" discussions between leaders of the two eye banks. Hooray, hooray! Progress to smile about!

NEW TOPIC – Spring Tour is back. Mark your calendars for Saturday, May 16, 10:00 AM tour sponsored by MN Lions Vision Foundation and MN Lions Hearing Foundation and done via the service our UoM Departments. Lunch included for the nominal registration fee of \$10.00. A great way to learn more and also to introduce newer members of our service. Watch for flyers and invitations coming to your club soon.

Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation News



The trustees for your Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation have been busy planning the 2020 De Feet Hearing Loss Walk at the University of Minnesota Landscape Arboretum in Chanhassen. The date for

this year's walk is Saturday, June 6, 2020. Check out our flyer that is in the newsletter for more details. Letters will be sent out to the clubs on March 1 with the registration information. Start planning now for you, your family and friends to join us for a fun walk at the Arboretum.

The Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation met on February 1. We had a presentation from Dr. Bevan Yueh about the future remodel and upgrades needed to the Temporal Bone Lab. The Foundation did a remodel of the lab about 20 years ago but space is now cramped and equipment is out dated. Parts for some of the equipment such as microscopes are no longer manufactured therefore they are looking for parts from used equipment. There will be more information on this in the next few months as the project develops. Current funds are already committed for other projects for the next year.

This Lab is very important to the University as it is used extensively in training new doctors. In the last 20 years our last investment has taught 50 Otolaryngologists, 20 neurosurgeons, 5 Neurotologists, a lot of medical students, approximately 10 research projects and 2 new Medical Device Companies were developed. An estimated 250,000 patients have been impacted by the doctors that have been trained in this lab.

The LCIF grant for the Children's Hearing Clinic has been approved. This grant is for the expansion of the Children's Clinic and the addition of one new sound proof room and the equipment needed for that room.

Thank you to all the clubs for your continued support. Without your support none of this could happen. Lions, keep collecting those hearing aids, they change the lives of many people all over the world.

Thank you to all the Lions who have been doing Kidsight. I know it is a lot of work and you Lions have been making your communities aware of what our motto is of "We Serve". We are trying to help you Lions in any way we can. One thing I have been trying to do for you is to get you all your reports properly filled out. I will review reports and their completion with any Lion who is unsure of the procedure. This should make it easier for you. I must report to the Multiple District Coordinator every quarter. Last quarter Oct 1st through December 31st we screened 447 kids in our District. We referred 48 kids. Follow up on referrals

continues to be a struggle, but we must make 3 attempts and then complete the follow up report and return them to me hopefully before the end of a quarter. We are making a difference in the kids' lives and reminding parents of the importance of vision. We know learning is 80% visual and if glasses are needed to see better to be a success in school and in life.

If any club would like a Kidsight presentation, I would love to try to fit it in my

schedule.

Again, in the spring camera use picks up in our district. So, this can affect planning a training session. We need to have a training session in the next couple of months, so we can get more Lions trained. Lions who were trained earlier may wish to be retrained because of the updates to the camera and adding the new printers. The date and location will be forthcoming. Leaving Prison Behind - A Prison Puppies Perspective

There is a saying among prisoners, everyone has their bit to do, some shorter than others. But each is long enough to impact a person's life. Puppy raiser John had this perspective on his prison experience.

When one enters a prison, and the door closes, the prison becomes your home, many do not use home instead refer to their "cell". Many people feel they are held against there will, therefore prison cannot be "home". John was in prison when this article was written, his joy in life does not come from his location or circumstances that brought him to this place.

When I leave this prison, I will not miss paying bills, I will not miss the routine. I will miss the men I have shared my laughs, tears, successes and failures. I will miss the simplicity of life. Especially I will miss Leader Dog Prison Puppies and the people from Leader Dog I worked with and gave me a purpose.

About two years ago, John asked to join the Leader Dog Prison Puppies with his Bunkie. My Bunkie had been approached to sign up, but he would not unless I was his partner. We became close friends and jailing together was easy. After several months with training older dogs, we felt we were ready for a puppy.

It was January when our puppy arrived. Our first day after acquiring the puppy was rather ruff for us and the puppy. It not particularly easy to live in a cinder block bathroom with another man. Add a puppy and even the best situations can be stressful. Small things like who has the puppy when or how to handle behavior problems became issues in a hurry. Small tensions grew and even became enormous. We quickly learned the difficulties of raising and training a puppy, one thing seemed to offset every negative, the puppy itself.

As months passed, we dealt with whatever arose. From everyday training, and care of the puppy, to a vet evaluation in Rochester, we learned together and grew. So did our female black lab, who now works with a client in Florida. After my first day with the puppy I was hooked. As an inmate, the opportunity to "give back" to society became important. Leader Dog Puppies gave me a purpose in ways that many lacked previously. Our families and friends could see that working with the puppy gave us great joy in being part of something so altruistic, gives meaning to the program. It gave a humanizing factor in a place that feels so dehumanizing. Even for lifers, it gives an opportunity for joy, love, and host of emotions they may never have an opportunity to experience. The intrinsic rewards of doing a good job at something bigger than yourself is the best part.

The dogs eventually leave through the same gates we hope to leave some day. That day can be difficult. John has left prison, and speaks of being nervous of what lies ahead, but understands the importance of the relationships he had in prison. Those relationships will not end, but change. John wishes to continue to work with Leader Dog. John has learned the joys of volunteering and giving back. Leader Dog has taught him to focus my time and energy to do good.


