Hope you all enjoyed your July and "Get Your Lion $\mathsf{On}"$





CONGRATULATIONS 5M2 for your participation in the 2018 D Feet Walk. 5M2 had 28 clubs participate in the Lions Hearing Foundation Signature Fund Raising Event. This was 5 more clubs than in 2017. It was not an

ideal day for the event with the rain falling most of the day. Even with the rain, several people enjoyed the walk and the offerings of the Landscape Arboretum. 5M2 had the most clubs attending of the eleven Districts attending. Yes, I know the event was held in our District, but it takes an effort to attend. As for the dollars raised, 5M2 gave a total of \$21,575. Your club can still donate if so desired. All monies donated will be used for research and the Children's Hearing Clinic. In 2017 \$8350 was raised. So we had a nice increase.

I know this is early to think about 2019 D Feet Walk

but I would like your club to consider participating in the event, both in person and financially. My goal would be for a few more clubs, 28 of 65 clubs participated in 2018. Can we do better? Also on the financial side, we can top the \$21575 funds raised in 5M2. I realize this is a double whammy with the request for funds for the Parade of Green at Mid Winter Convention. Plan early and budget for both events.

The total funds raised at the 2018 D Feet Walk was \$120,848.34 to date. Total raised for the 7 years of the Fund raiser is \$724,572.39. A huge thank you to the clubs in MD5M and the sponsors that donate. Again to the clubs of 5M2, thank you for your support of the Lions Hearing Foundation. Please continue to support our fund raisers.

And sometimes the road is winding! The year 2017-2018 was full of adventure. Not only did the Vision Foundation conduct business as usual but we also established our new logo and renamed our eye bank Lions Gift of Sight (LGS). Plus you have all become familiar with the acronym LEI – Lions Eye Institute.

But now, we tell you about a significant bend in the road. In January 2018, the U of M Department of Ophthalmology and the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation learned that Life Source established a relationship with another eye bank – SightLife based in Seattle, WA.

Life Source is the Upper Midwest's tissue procurement organization. A contract still exists with Life Source but it is revised. SightLife has established relationships with some Minnesota hospitals. Our Lions Gift of Sight has maintained relationships with many Minnesota hospitals and some in bordering North Dakota. This, of course, affects the volume of activity done by Lions Gift of Sight.

Because of this, the last several months have been a flurry of activity handling the situation and establishing avenues of action. As directors of MLVF, we are amazed and proud of the strenuous and grave work being done to keep LGS in the forefront. Lions Gift of Sight is one of the eight largest eye banks in our country. LGS is proud of our heritage – 58 years of serving together. The road has been a journey of pride and quality, but this is a pretty darn big bump in the road. But, as Minnesotans, we all understand road construction, don't we?

As a result, LEI is not on schedule. On Saturday, June 9, DGE Diana and PDG Mary attended a special meeting bringing us up to speed on all actions being pursued by the University and LGS to maintain the status of LGS as the premier, sizable eye bank it is. We are a non-profit organization keeping donated eyes local. Absolutely critical not only for corneal transplants but for research, too. Our capacity for research must be maintained – we are the best!

So wishes and thoughts...As directors, we continue to View Forward. Our legacy is great and our goals will continue to be met. Now, in this new year, Lion Christy Trutnau and Lion Mary Spille will be your directors ready to serve. Reminding you again that now is time to plan your club visits for the coming year. 
