


Lion Glenn Kaufmann District Governor Elect

Fellow 5M2 Lions,

Spring seems to definitely be here. I saw several dandelions in someone else's front yard. Sandals have overtaken boots in my closet. And we've even attended our first MN Twins game since 2019. Things are happening here and around the world. Check out these short stories about how you, through LCIF are supporting the work of Lions in MN and beyond:

Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation received a LCIF Matching Grant of \$100,000 to acquire a Spectralis Flex HRA+OCT2. This equipment can scan a supine patient in surgery or elsewhere. The equipment will allow Doctors to obtain intra---operative images of the retina to determine the effect of the surgery before they leave the eye and thus prevent having to do a second surgery at a later date. The Spectralis Flex at the U of M will be the first in an operating room in the United States and will ensure that the Minnesota Health Ambulatory Surgery Center will be equipped with the latest ophthalmic surgical technologies. This equipment allows for state---of---the----art diagnostic and treatment capabilities located in one of the most advanced surgical centers in the Midwest. Thank you to all the Lions of MD5M for their generous donations. Without the Lions the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation could not do all the great things it does.

Second graders at Chatterton Elementary School in Merrick, New York felt the positive effects of Lions Quest, LCIF's social and emotional learning curriculum.

LCIF has awarded a US\$10,000 Emergency grant to St. Vincent Lions in District 60-B for volcano relief. Lions will use the funds to support immediate needs for those relocated to safe regions (in shelters) outside the danger area.

When two Lions clubs in Italy learned about the food insecurity in West African villages, they wanted to help. They collaborated with the Koudougou Baobab Lions Club in Burkina Faso and with a US\$54,267 LCIF grant, they completed a very successful project.

The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included. However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program. Participants MUST be available to attend ALL sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday afternoon. Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, *if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions.* The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants. Applications are available from your District Governor or on the MD5M Website and are due (without fees) by September 30, 2021. Your District Governor will then make the final participant selection. Institute graduates will tell you that the Regional Lions Leadership Institute is beneficial for you in every facet of your life and not just in your role as a Lion.

Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Project

Do you have a low-income person who needs hearing aids? There is a procedure that needs to be followed in

order for your club to help out. First, that person must see an audiologist for a hearing evaluation. The audiologist should work with Medicare and/or Lions clubs to help with costs of hearing tests and later installation of hearing aids.

After the evaluation, if the person needs hearing aids, the audiologist needs to order hearing aids from Starkey (address below). Your district should have money in their Starkey account from the used hearing aids that your district has donated. This money will provide free aids for the person. The audiologist then calls territory account manager at Starkey to order hearing aids. Your district trustee will help get that information for you. The audiologist then will fit the aids. Lions Clubs may have to offer some financial assistance.



If your recipient is young person up to age 15, the audiologist may want to check with other hearing aids companies for grants to help with purchasing hearing aids for children.

Lions Club International also has more information and materials to help with hearing aids in a program called Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Project (Lions AHAP) available only through local Lions clubs. 




Tidbits from the Past (taken from past district newsletters)

Did you know in the past there was an annual 5M Lions Day at "The Twins". A newsletter ad in 1989 states "2nd Annual 5M Day at The Twins. Saturday noon – July 15, 1989, Game Time 12:50 p.m., Twins vs Boston, 10,000 Reserved Seats.

Do you remember when District 5M2 had the following Lioness Clubs – Albert Lea Lioness (now the Albert Lea Lakeview Lions), Carver Lioness, Hutchinson Lioness (still in existence 2020-21), Jordan Lioness (now the Jordan Jordaness Lions), Lake Crystal Lioness, LeCenter Lioness, N.E.W. Lioness, Prior Lake Lioness, Shakopee Lioness (now the Shakopee Valley Lions) and West Carver Lioness (now the NYA West Carver Lions). Over the years, the 5M2 Lioness clubs either chartered as a Lions Club or members joined an existing Lions club in their communities. Since 2018, Lions Club International has provided incentives and the Lioness Bridge Program to encourage Lioness clubs to become Lions. The LCI Board of Directors has made the decision to end the Lioness Bridge Program after June 30, 2021. Lioness Clubs that decide not to join Lions Clubs International will no longer be considered a sponsored activity of a Lions club, and will lose all associated benefits. This includes protection under Lions Clubs International's general liability insurance, and utilization of all registered trademarks of LCI, including Lioness logo.
