
This being my first of about thirty newsletter articles that I will be writing for the Lions of 5M-2. My mind has been on what I should say that sounds intelligent, honest, sincere, and entertaining. While I will not be able to hit on all four cylinders in one article, I do hope that over the

next three years I can at least do one of these in a single article and accomplish them all by the end of three years.

On the fourth of July we celebrate our Nations birthday. This got me thinking about the Lions birthday. We do not often celebrate it. But do we know when and where the Lions started? For sure the first meeting was on June 17, 1917. By a group of twelve men led by our founder Melvin Jones. Later that year they held their first National Convention in Dallas Texas. Twenty-two clubs were represented by Thirty-six delegates. Not exactly a booming organization yet. By 1920 there had been many clubs joining the organization here in the United Sates and in Canada. So, at a convention held in Windsor Ontario of that year giving the organization is proper name "The International Association of Lions Clubs." Now Lions are recognized by their emblem throughout the world. It consists of the Gold Letter "L" in the circular purple. Bordering the circular gold area with "Lions" at the top and "International" on the bottom. The Lion has two faces, representing the past and the future. The motto "We Serve" was adopted. Purple represents loyalty to friends, self and integrity of mind and heart. Gold symbolizes sincerity of purpose, liberality in judgment, purity of life and generosity in mind, heart, and purpose towards humanity. The slogan of "LIONS" means: "Liberty, Intelligence, Our Nations Safety."

Today the Lions have over 1.4 million members in over 210 countries. We are currently working to get over the 1.5 million members within the next couple of years. But we need to have every club's help and every member to make this happen. I would like to start with every club in 5M-2 getting at least one new member. This would be an awesome start getting to our goal of 1.5 members. I will be tracking each club this year to help you make it happen. If you need help, please reach out to one of the District Governor's team so we can be there to help.

I am here to serve you, help serve others. "We Serve"





5M-2 Disaster Relief

Lions of MD5M,

District 5M-2 is currently facing unprecedented devastation caused by heavy rains and flooding. Massive flooding is now impacting nearly half of Minnesota. More than 20 river gauges across the Upper Midwest have hit major flood stage, with more rain expected in flood-soaked areas. It is imperative for Lions to take the lead in supporting fellow Lions and the communities we serve during this challenging time. We are looking for help to all those that have



suffered great loss and destruction due to the flooding. Water levels on the Minnesota, Mississippi and Crow rivers are expected to see their highest levels in at least a decade.

5M-2 District Governor Lisa and her Disaster Relief Team have devised a plan to assist Lions Clubs in 5M-2 as they navigate through this unfamiliar territory.

Our district is exploring avenues and will be seeking a grant from LCIF. Unfortunately it's times like these, that we Lions realize the importance and need for LCIF and why it's necessary for all of us to support our Foundation. Where there's a need, LCIF is there!

The Lions of 5M-2 will also need donations to supplement the LCIF grants, as they have greater flexibility and less restrictions, and can be used to fill in the gaps left by the LCIF funds.

Stay tuned for updates from the Disaster Relief Team on ways you can contribute financially and with your skills.


