District 5M-2 PARADE OF GREEN

The Parade of Green is an integral part of our Mid-Winter Convention. The purpose of the Parade of Green is to provide our district Lions Clubs with the opportunity to make monetary donations to foundations/programs we support.

A list of foundations/programs our district supports is below. The list includes if they are a 501 (c)(3) and their tax identification number. If the foundation/program is a 501 (c)(3), donations can come from either gambling or project funds. If not, funding may only come from project funds.

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF): (501 (c)(3)/23-7030455) LCIF is the main humanitarian arm of the Lions around the world. Donated funds are recorded as a Melvin Jones donation. For every \$1,000 donated, your Club may present a Melvin Jones Fellow Award. Records for donations are kept by LCIF. This year we are excited to host the Special Olympic Games in Minnesota. Multiple District 5M has committed to a \$350,000 sponsorship in the way of a "pass thru grant" from LCIF. Please put in the memo of your check MD5M Special Olympics to ensure your donation goes to the correct designation.

Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation: (501 (c)(3)/41-6026488) The Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation has been working to help the blind and visually impaired since 1960. Through their support of Lions Gift of Sight (formerly Minnesota Lions Eye Bank), their collaboration with the University of Minnesota's Department of Ophthalmology, and their work collecting and distributing used eyeglasses, the Foundation helps countless people every day. Donated funds are recorded as a Helen Keller donation. For every \$1,000 donated, your Club may present a Helen Keller Award in honor of those who have distinguished themselves on behalf of sight. Records for donations are kept by the Vision Foundation.

Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation: (501(c)(3)/ 41-6172730) The Foundation was founded in 1973 to promote to the fullest extent the advance of research and programs concerned with hearing health and communication disorders. Further, it was founded to provide assistance with the organization and administration of these activities throughout the Lions Multiple District 5M, which encompasses Minnesota, Manitoba, and Northwestern Ontario. For every \$1,000 donated your Club may present a Hearing Research Fellowship. A second donation in the same named individual will receive a Progressive Fellowship.

Diabetes: Clubs can donate to either or both.

MN Lions Diabetes Foundation: (501 (c)(3)/26-3238179) Foundation is dedicated to improving the quality of life for people with diabetes by funding research to cure diabetes, providing education and sponsoring preventive health activities. Donated funds are recorded as a Dream Catcher donation. For every \$1,000 donated, your Club may present a Dream Catcher Award. Records for donations are kept by your own Club.

5M-2 Diabetes: Funds stay in District 5M-2.

MN Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation: (501 (c)(3)/83-2970348) A charity of the Lions Clubs of Minnesota to support efforts to end childhood cancer. A relatively new initiative by the Foundation involves partnering with local Lions Clubs to help local families dealing with childhood cancer. Thus far, we have approved matches \$500 to three local Lions Clubs who had fundraisers for local families. The Believe Award has been established to recognize Clubs and individuals who have donated \$1,000 to the Foundation to further our mission to assist patients and families dealing with childhood cancer.

MD5M KidSight Foundation: (501 (c)(3)/81-3338106) KidSight is a program to screen the vision of children, primarily between the ages of 6 months and 6 years. About 7 to 15% of children screened will be referred for follow-up professional exams. For every \$1,000 donated your club may present a "Sight

Saver" award.

Can Do Canines: (501 (c)(3)/41-1594165) Can do Canines raises and trains Mobility Assist, Diabetes Assist, Autism Assist, Hearing Assist, Seizure Assist and other Service Dogs. The dogs are provided at no charge to the recipient. For every \$1,000 donated your Club may present a "Top Dog" award. Donation records are kept by Can do Canines

Leader Dogs for the Blind: (501 (c)(3)/38-1366931) People who are blind or visually impaired endure hardships most of us can barely imagine. Things that were once routine and taken for granted may gradually or suddenly become insurmountable hurdles. Leader Dogs for the Blind provide white cane training to matching people with a Leader Dog, they provide the tools and training to reintroduce people to a life of independence, confidence and companionship. It's a way of living that leads to a new perspective on life.

Project New Hope Lions Foundation of Minnesota: (501 (c)(3)/27-2749699) Provides family retreats for veterans and their families with educational skills to manage their lives after wartime service. The organization provides these activities totally free to the veterans and their families.

TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation (501)(3)88-1542839 TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation will support Multiple District 5M Lions Clubs with matching 50/50 Fund Grants, for up to \$3000 initially. This will help fill gaps where an LCIF grant is too large or otherwise not appropriate. Smaller Lions Clubs projects will be funded.

Youth Exchange: Clubs can donate to either or both.

5D5M Youth Exchange: (501 (c)(3)/46-4182698) The Lions Youth Exchange Program was launched to provide today's youth, our leaders of tomorrow, an opportunity to learn about people and cultures other than their own in an effort to promote world peace. Young people are given the opportunity of living with a family or families in a foreign country for a few weeks to experience first-hand a new culture, history and a different way of life. The ultimate goal is to have each participant upon returning home share his or her experiences in promoting international understanding.

5M-2 Youth Exchange: Funds stay in 5M-2.

5M-2 Youth Outreach: The Youth Outreach program is a part of the Lions Organization encompassing Leos, Peace Poster, Essay Contest, Liberty Day & Write-Off.

Leader Dog for the Blind: Puppy Raising Volunteer Update

Leader Dog for the Blind is seeking volunteers for its Puppy Raising program. Puppy raisers provide a loving home and basic training for a future Leader Dog over a period of 18 months to two years. This commitment involves teaching the puppy essential obedience, socialization, and good house manners. Volunteers receive ongoing support and guidance from Leader Dog staff throughout the process.

Recently, a Leader Dog client experienced a setback after surgery when her guide dog was unable to continue working with her. Leader Dog staff maintained close contact, and the dog was returned for retraining but did not meet the necessary standards. The client has received refresher training in white cane skills while awaiting a new guide dog as the client progresses to rehabilitation from pass

surgery. This situation highlights Leader Dog's dedication to client safety and ongoing support.

A current donor has pledged to match all donations to Leader Dog. Any contribution, regardless of size, will have double the impact.

Continued support from Lions clubs is essential, especially for the Parade of Green at the Midwinter event in Mankato. Leader Dog's commitment to its clients underscores the importance of ongoing support.

Can Do Canines to Host Open House November 8

The joint effort by the New Ulm and Lafayette Lions is a unique venture across district lines in that New Ulm is in District 5M3 and Lafayette in District 5M2.



Prior Lake Lions

Plastic bags collected in the bins outside of Club Prior is being put to good use and the result can be found throughout the city.

The Prior Lake Lions Club, in partnership with Smoke Signals and Club Prior, continues to coordinate the collection of clean plastic bags that are recycled and then turned into outdoor park benches.

Volunteers from the club pick up the plastic each week, which is weighed and stored until 1,000 pounds has accumulated. Once that is achieved, an order for a park bench is placed and shipped to Trex, a manufacturer of outdoor furniture. Once created, the bench is then installed at a pre-designated location within the area.

To date, a dozen park benches have been made from the recycled plastic and can be found at these locations: Club Prior, McKenna Crossing, Prior Lake City Hall, Fong's, The Little Market/Smoke Signals, Cub Foods, Harbor View, Velishek Auto Sales, Prior Lake VFW, Prior Lake Pickleball Court, Doherty's Bar and Grill and St. Paul Lutheran Church.

The bench project is just one of many efforts undertaken by Prior Lake Lions Club members.

Lions Club International has always been a strong promoter of initiatives that improve eyesight. For years, local members have assisted with vision screenings at local daycares and schools. They are scheduled to begin a new round of screenings later this month in Prior Lake elementary schools, followed by the middle schools in January, and St. Paul's Lutheran School, St. Michael Catholic School and Aspen Academy in 2026.

Prior Lake Lions also help in restocking diabetic kits containing crackers and glucose gel packs that can be distributed by school nurses to treat children with hypoglycemia. The volunteers do highway cleanup on a stretch of Highway 13 south of Lydia, as well. Throughout the year, the club donates to the CAP Agency and other worthy causes.
