- Are you a current or incoming Club President, Secretary, or Treasurer? Start the Club President (Secretary/Treasurer) Learning Path, to include <u>Club Officer Training and Club President (Secretary/Treasurer) Responsibilities</u>.
- Are you looking for ways to improve your club's meetings and interaction? Take a course on <u>Delegation</u>,
 <u>Effective Teams</u>, <u>Goal Setting</u>, <u>Conflict Resolution</u>, or <u>Meeting Management</u>.
- Courses that work on individual skills are: <u>Time Management</u>, <u>Team Motivation</u>, <u>Coaching</u>, and <u>Effective Listening</u>.

"Hey, Glenn. I'm not a club officer. What about me?" Glad you asked. Many of the above courses provide valuable information for every member of both the club and district, no matter our role. We all have gaps we can fill.

Other ways to improve are by participating in innovative sessions DG Anna, myself, 1VDGE Kathleen and PDG Nancy are planning. The 2021 International Convention is virtual this year as well. June 25-29 2021. Go to lcicon.lionsclubs.org and register. This one there is a registration fee.



Lions that are selected as participants in the Institute must be in good standing in a Lions Club and may not be a 1st Vice District Governor, District Governor, Past District Governor, International Director, or Past International Director.

The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included.

However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program.

Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Project

Do you have a low-income person who needs hearing aids? There is a procedure that needs to be followed in order for your club to help out. First, that person must see an audiologist for a hearing evaluation. The audiologist should work with Medicare and/or Lions clubs to help with costs of hearing tests and later installation of hearing aids.

After the evaluation, if the person needs hearing aids, the audiologist needs to order hearing aids from Starkey (address below). Your district should have money in their Starkey account from the used hearing aids that your district has donated. This money will provide free aids for the person. The audiologist then calls territory account manager at Starkey to order hearing aids. Your district trustee will help get that information for you. The audiologist then will fit the aids. Lions Clubs may have to offer some financial assistance.



If your recipient is young person up to age 15, the audiologist may want to check with other hearing aids companies for grants to help with purchasing hearing aids for children.

Lions Club International also has more information and materials to help with hearing aids in a program called Lions Affordable Hearing Aid Project (Lions AHAP) available only through local Lions clubs. 
