5M-2 Lions Rock!

Wow, what an amazing weekend of giving at the 5M-2 Mid-Winter Convention. In addition to the Parade of Green and LCIF fundraising, Lions donated \$255 in the way of an offering during the Sunday service which was donated to KidSight. After visiting DG Shari Neidhardt shared what the Awesome Breastforms (www.

awesomenbreatforms.org) is all about, a passing of the hat generated ~\$700 for the project. It costs DG Shari approximately \$25 per set of forms, along with the donation from the District this will provided 35 sets to women who have had mastectomies, all free of charge. What a wonderful project of giving women their curves back.

A few words on the cost of the Mid-Winter Convention. In addition to the ever popular raffle baskets, there were three silent auction items donated by the Chanhassen Lions. Together these items raised \$4,210. Once all the bills are paid, we are hoping to donate \$2,000 to LCIF and adding the remaining amount to the convention rainy day fund. There is currently \$2,000 in the fund, the intent is to have a fund to offer some protection for the future should the costs ever exceed the budget.

Many Lions might not be aware \$1.40 of the district dues contributes to the cost of the convention, this amount equates to ~\$3,200, the district cabinet approved \$5,500. The convention committee to date has received the \$3,200 and will not need the additional \$1,500 due to the convention committee's fundraising efforts. Out of these funds, \$1,000 is donated in the visiting International Directors name to LCIF. At the end of the convention, a check of ~\$20,000 was written to the Country Inn & Suites to cover the cost of the convention. In addition, the convention booklet has a cost of \$2,200. Most of this cost is able to be covered by the ads sold. Something new this year was adding sponsors who helped to cover costs of things like the DJ, pizza on Friday night, free keg of beer and dessert on Saturday night. Thank you to all the foundations, businesses, foundations and Lions who helped support the convention by placing ads and/or being a sponsor. The DG team and convention committee does everything we can to keep the costs of attending the convention as low as possible. Our district convention continues to be one of the lowest costs to attend in MD5M.

If you attended the convention, hope you had a wonderful time. We tried a few new things and did some of the same. After three years we are getting comfortable in the space and think we have figured out a few things. DGE Shermayne has made note of things which can be improved upon for next year. There will be a survey coming out in March once Lions Greg and Colleen Fletcher return from a well-deserved vacation. The hotel now have a General Manager after over a year without. The restaurant should be opening later this spring, and they are working on a plan to renovate.

Cannot sign-off this month without mentioning two important things. Membership, we are 50 members short of hitting our district's goal of adding 205 new Lions. There are four months of the Lions year remaining, we can do it. Please think about asking or inviting one new person to serve with your club. When people serve, they see the important work we do as Lions. Let's Make our Mark as we know Lions rock!

The second important topic is LCIF. PDG Anna Wickenhauser and Lion Rose Thies are working hard to reach the goal LCIF has set for our district. If every Lion in 5M-2 gave \$20 to LCIF between now and the end of the year our district would hit our goal. That is less than what our district has received in the way of grants from LCIF this Lions year. Would \$20 change your life? Probably not, but it can change the life of someone else.

The quote to end the newsletter this month is what I hope our zone meetings will not be this spring. Watch for news on your upcoming zone meetings in April and May!

Kidsight would like to Thank all the clubs in 5M2 who donated to the Parade of Green. We are in the process of updating our Kidsight cameras. The cameras are eight years old and we can't get a new warranty on them. As with technology things change and need for improvements will make our program more efficient.



Kidsight has been successful with a few of our clubs getting into the schools and that has increased our numbers for screenings. A screening is not a diagnostic, it is just a screening to recommend to parents of a possible visual problem. 80% of learning is visual, so it is vital for student success to in their education. To get screenings in schools completed speak to the school nurse and recommend they get the vision screening consent form with a packet of consents parents must complete at the beginning of the school year. That way, the Local Lion's club does not need to get the consent. The consent should be an OPT OUT only from the school. We are now recommending that the students in 6th, 7th and 8th grades be screened

because those are the ages when kids' eyes are changing because of puberty. The Kldsight cameras are 95% accurate. Kidsight is now an international program. So, our program is growing through success of our screenings.

We would love to get more clubs trained. To be more personal to clubs we are now changing to Club Training on the Kidsight program

and camera use to facilitate a more personnel training of camera use and reports to complete. The reports are important as they provide information on children and students whom have been screened and triggers of the individuals that are referred.

We would like to thank all the Clubs in 5M2 for the donations for Leader Dog for the Parade of Green at the recent convention.


Leader Dog is celebrating 85 years of service to the visually impaired communities around the world. Leader Dog began in 1939 with broad idea by three Detroit Lions to honor the request of Helen Keller to be "Knights of the Blind". They have accomplished many things in that amount of time with servicing every state and nearly 50 countries or more in the world with Leader Dogs to assist the visually impaired.

Leader Dog needs volunteers and would fail to be able to provide service Dogs for FREE to the blind without them. The biggest need at this time is Puppy Raisers. I would be happy to provide information for becoming a Puppy Raiser volunteer for 18 to 24 months. Leader Dog placed over 100 dogs last year to needy individual's. Leader Dog is proud of there Breeding process and try to raise only the best dogs.

To give you an idea of the number of volunteers Leader Dog needs I am going to point out the different volunteer opportunities. The life cycle of a Leader Dog. Volunteer Breeding Dog host. This involves birthing puppies and many OB visits to Leader Dog vets in the birthing process. Puppies are returned to Leader Dog at approximately 6

weeks of age. They are examined and Xray for any developmental deformities. Labs are prone to hip dysplasia and are not fully trained as a Leader Dog if anytime during the growth process any developmental problems arise. After Medical exams and other behavior exams the puppy is placed with a Puppy Raiser. This 18-to-24-month process is the greatest need for volunteers. If anyone is interested, please feel free to contact me. One does not need to live near the Leader Dog Corporate facilities in Michigan to raise a puppy. After the Puppy Raising process the dogs are recess for placement. NOT all puppies meet the Leader Dogs guidelines and are not placed to move further in training process. After 2 years, the puppy is returned to Leader Dog for pairing with a client. Instructors will take in account the dogs walking speed, strength, size, energy levels, balance and stability, environmental tolerance and if the possible recipient has children in the home. So Leader Dog is extremely choosey with their dogs and want to match the best dog with each client. Once the Client is match, they will receive indebt training with their service dog match. Leader Dog continues to monitor the dogs while with the client to analyze the dogs safety, care and compatibility with the client. So, this is a long process. Leader Dog for the Blind is so grateful for the support they receive Lions Clubs worldwide.
