5M2 Lions Cup

5M2 Lion members believe it or not - Summer is here! With Summer brings about many outdoor activities including golf. Several Clubs in 5M2 will be hosting golf tournaments with a few already taking place. To encourage 5M2 Lions to participate in the various golf tournaments



hosted by 5M2 Lion Clubs the inaugural season of the 5M2 Lions Cup officially kicks off at the end of May. The 5M2 Lions Cup will be awarded to the club with the highest point total at next year Mid-Winter Convention. Clubs can earn points in three ways.

First, 50 pts for each member, in good standing, that plays in a 5M2 golf tournament. Secondly, 300 points to the Clubs that host a tournament as they will not earn points for Club members that participate in their own tournament. Third, the tourney inside the tourney points awarded to the top performing 5M2 Lion Club teams against other 5M2 Lion Club teams.

May 31st will be the first chance to earn points as the Hamburg Lions will be hosting a golf tourney that morning at the Glencoe Country. 7 am registration. 8 am shotgun start with lunch and prizes to follow after the round.

June 2nd the LeSueur Lions will be hosting a tournament at the Le Sueur Country Club.

June 13th the N.E.W. Lions will be hosting a tournament at Creeksbend Golf Course in New Prague. Registration at noon and shotgun start at 1 pm. Dinner and prizes to follow the round as well.

I look forward to seeing everyone out at these events and the ones coming later in the year. The 5M2 trophy will be on display at all of these events. In the rare chance you are unable to attend any of these golf tournaments here is what the trophy looks like.
