#### MD5M Hall of Fame

My favorite story about Megan has to do with driving a car. When PDG Darwin and I were talking to Megan about speaking at the 2010 Mid-Winter she told us she had a goal to one day drive a car. Well, sometime after that conversation, I heard on the news that driverless cars were being tested. The next time I saw Megan I couldn't wait to tell her what I heard. Megan responded by saying -"Oh, I've already driven one of those." She went on to explain a prototype had been available at a convention for the blind that she attended and of course, she tried it out. Megan was a true inspiration on how not to let a disability prevent persons from doing the things they love.

Thank you also to those who have expressed condolences on the passing of my father-in-law, Walter Mathwig. Walter lived a full life and died the morning after our convention at the age of 97. He has now joined Darwin and two daughters-in-law but leaves behind a family legacy of his spouse of 73 years, eight children and five in-laws, 26 grandchildren and 20 in-laws, 50 great-grandchildren and 2 in-laws and 5 great, great-grandchildren. His legacy lives on!

Our upcoming months will be busy ones! Please note the spring date for New Officer training. We are trying a Saturday morning time in an effort to lessen disruptions to everyone's busy weekend schedules. While we generally refer to it as "New" officer training, the new actually refers to the upcoming year's officers, whether new or experienced. 

We felt we needed to have faces of people with diabetes to better tell this story. We didn't have far to look! Two of our Trustees have immediate family members that have diabetes. They volunteered to be the "faces of diabetes" for us. Working with a team at the U of M they put together the video for us. It tells the story of two families and how their lives are impacted by diabetes.

#### 2016 World Diabetes Day Events Held

In November -All across Minnesota - in Fridley, Brooklyn Center, Roseville, Duluth and Rochester inside Walmart Stores, and in Worthington and Windom at Hy-Vee Stores, and in Jackson at Sunshine Foods - MN Lion's Diabetes Foundation trustees hosted World Diabetes Day events to help identify those at risk for type 2 diabetes and provide information on ways to lower the risk through lifestyle change.

World Diabetes Day was created in 1991 by the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) and World Health Organizations in response to the increasing health threat posed by diabetes. **Diabetes is a growing epidemic.** One in four people will be diagnosed with diabetes in their lifetime.

Over 1,000 people across the state participated at our community events!

MLDF partnered with these organizations on this event: The U of MN Extension Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed), Local YMCAs, and Health Care organizations that provided Certified Diabetes Educators.

Huge Thanks to all of our partners and to Walmart for providing us the space and staff along with the water bottles filled with snacks for all who participated, and gift certificates for drawings at each location.

This tremendous effort succeeded in creating awareness as to the increasing numbers of people who are at risk for type 2 diabetes, identifying those at risk

and providing resources to help individuals make potentially lifesaving changes to their lives.

#### **CAN DO CANINES**

Thanks to the support of Lions Clubs across 5M, Can Do Canines continues to train specially trained for people with disabilities and provide them to those in need, free of charge.

One recipient of a Can Do Canines assistance dog is James Pick. James now has a greater sense of freedom, independence and peace of mind since thanks to Mobility Assist Dog Oakley. Read their story below.



#### JAMES PICK & MOBILITY ASSIST DOG OAKLEY

Brainerd, Minn. resident James Pick has a new roommate: Mobility Assist Dog Oakley. James is living with multiple sclerosis (MS), a chronic disease which attacks the central nervous system. "Because of my MS I have problems with balance and I fatigue easily," says James. Without family close by James and his loved ones were living with a lot of worries; with Oakley around James has an assistant to help him with tasks as well as providing greater peace of mind for both himself and his family.

Mobility Assistance Dog Oakley is a gorgeous threeand-a-half-year-old black Labrador. James notes that she is very polite, well-behaved, and a great worker. Oakley was trained by Can Do Canines staff. She retrieves dropped items for James such as his cane or cell phone, helps tug off clothing, opens and closes doors, and braces to help James up if he falls. Having Oakley as his Mobility Assist Dog fills James' life beyond the daily help with tasks, "Oakley is my best friend."

"Retrieving items for me and taking my socks off at night are some of the most significant things she does for me every day."

Oakley has changed James' life immensely. "I feel like I'm not alone in this anymore. I have someone who loves and cares for me. I didn't realize how much it would help my psyche," says James. Oakley and James are a successful team because he made Oakley's training a top priority. He took the training so seriously that he put playing his guitar (his most favorite activity) on the back burner in-order to be fully present. James feels proud and a sense of accomplishment for the energy and commitment he's devoted to training Oakley.

To the supporters who made James and Oakley a success, James says, "All I can say is thank you! You're going to make me cry, but thank you for all you do!"




