Do you find your Lions Club not making as great an impact in the surrounding communities as they used to? Are they sliding down a slippery slope? There are outside the box ways you can broaden your club's reach!

Make a list of areas in your community that might be under-represented. Is there room in your community for more service? Do you have Retirement Communities in your town with residents who may have time to give back, but don't have the ability or means to get to a monthly meeting? Maybe there are more than a few like-minded individuals in the facility. How about a Retirement Community Branch Club, Cyber Club or Specialty Club?



The longer we met virtually, the more we got used to it. When we get back to a way of life we were used to do you think there are other members of your community or club who would benefit from going completely virtual?

Club branches are a way in which a club can diversify their membership by engaging a small group of people who want to make a difference

in their community. Club branches allow people to serve as Lions who may not be inclined to join the parent club.

Members of a club branch become part of an existing parent club, but may hold independent meetings and activities. The parent club appoints a branch liaison to serve as the go-between for the parent and the club branch, allowing club branches a high level of autonomy from their parent if that is desired.

Did you know you can start a Branch Club with only five new or existing members? Other requirements are:

- An existing club willing to engage these members as a branch of their club
- A member of the parent club to serve as branch liaison
- Notification sent to the District Governor

The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included.

However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program.

Participants MUST be available to attend ALL sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday afternoon.

Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions.

The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants.

Your District Governor will then make the final participant selection.




PROTOCOL PLEASE!!

Recently, we learned about a Lion's member who was having problems with her speaking due to a narrowed voice box. She has a hoarse voice and was unable to speak loudly enough to be heard at a cabinet meeting, so her husband spoke for her. Luckily, a member of our foundation learned of her difficulty and suggested looking into the Lions Voice Clinic. The Lions Voice Clinic may be able to help.

Most of our Minnesota Lions members have not heard about this clinic. The Lions Voice Clinic was established to:

- evaluate & treat voice disorders
- provide a full range of state-of-the-art voice care
- educate individuals about the human voice
- research all aspects of voice use
- specialize in treating singers, actors, & others with professional voices

It has information about the care team, the voice and problems associated with it, treatments available, and answers general questions, such as who develops voice problems, different types of disorders, etc.

There is also a link to sign up for an appointment as well as important links to other sources such as the National Center for Voice and Speech, American Cancer Society and UMN Dept. of Speech, Language and Hearing Sciences.

Tidbits from the Past

(taken from past district newsletters and history)

Membership has been a main focus for Lions throughout our history though over the years the name has changed. The current focus in North America is called NAMI - North American Membership Initiative, and will soon be known as the GMA - Global Membership Approach.

In 1990-1991, the Cabinet position was "Membership, Development & Retention (which included Journey for Sight) and was chaired by Lion Jack Webster of the Waterville Lions club. In 1993-1994, Journey for Service was split from Membership, Development & Retention and became a separate Cabinet position with Lion Jack Webster as chair. In 2003-2004 Journey for Sight became known as Journey for Service, with Lion Jack as its chair, and remains Journey for Service to this day. PDG Mike Vos has been the current Journey For Service chair.

In 2001 – 2002, Membership was a stand-alone Cabinet position with Lion Leo Pouliot of the Hamburg Lions Club as chair.

In 2004 – 2005, Membership was part of the new team concept of MERLO – Membership, Extension, Retention, Leadership and Orientation. In 2020 – 2021, Membership is known as GMT – Global Membership Team – and is currently chaired by Council Chair Brian Thies.

While the specific Cabinet title has changed over the years, with different ideas on membership recruitment, the goal is still to bring in members who are interested in building relationships and improving the world through kindness. It's 1.4 million caring men and women serving together so they can make a lasting impact and change more lives.

We also look at his/her work ethics.

After a couple of years of hiatus, we were fortunate to be able to reconvene giving scholarships. The money will be sent to the winner upon receiving information about the completion of his/her first semester of college and information regarding his/her continuation of education.

This year's scholarships are being awarded to two Nicollet Public School Seniors: Samantha Rist and Ethan Matter. Samantha plans to attend Minnesota State University – Mankato to pursue a Bachelor's degree in Aviation Management. She also plans to join the Army ROTC program and commission into the United States Army as an officer after graduation. Ethan plans to attend South Central College and then Mankato State University for Manufacturing Engineering. He would like to have his own shop to do woodworking and metal working projects.

The Courtland Lions had a few busy days this past week. On Friday, April 30, seven Lions worked at the Lions Park clipping a few low-lying branches, raking leaves, and inspecting the equipment. The Park will be sprayed for weeds this coming week. They will report back to the Club indicating some needed changes.


