After meeting with the staff and doctors, it became clear just how much this project would impact the children having procedures at the clinics. This small token of comfort given to each child, will help ease their recovery process in more ways than can be imagined. On February 3 we had another sew in event and completed an additional 24 Lion Lovey's and 100 pillowcases. Without your support, financial or otherwise, this would not have been possible! Since this is an on-going project, our goal is to provide a combination of 1500 pillowcases and Lovey's for distribution per year. We look forward to your continued support to this project as it cannot be done without you.
