


The zone meetings are coming up. These meetings are open to all club members, not just the club officers. The following zone meetings have been scheduled:

He specializes in creating youth leadership programming by teaching strategic thinking and service learning. PDG Daniel is one of the founders of the Lions Virtual movement and has presented at several

Donate Life Month



Donate Life Month is a time to celebrate and honor organ, eye, tissue, whole body, blood, and bone marrow donors, all of whom have saved or bettered the lives of other individuals, often strangers. Each year, the Lions Gift of Sight eye bank kicks off the month with a Donate life flag raising

ceremony at their Saint Paul home.

Coffee, cookies, and wonderful speakers from Lions Gift of Sight, the University of Minnesota, and partner donation organizations help to raise awareness of the gifts of donation, before and after death. By raising the Donate Life flag, we also honor those who have already given.

Lions Day at the Capitol

The Maple Grove Lions were the host club that coordinated the Lions Day at the Capitol. There were approximately twenty Lions and two Leos present at the gathering in the Rotunda on Tuesday, March 18, 2025.

After some brief introductions and background information, Representative Kristin Robbins from Maple Grove and District 37A said a few words about what she is trying to accomplish that would benefit charitable organizations around the state of Minnesota. She has sponsored a bill to reduce the taxes that charities pay to the state to a flat rate of 5%. There is another bill trying to eliminate taxes completely. The current tax rate starts at 8% and rises to 33.5% for proceeds over \$157,501 for charitable gambling like pull tabs. Many clubs with charitable gambling only have about 40% of their gambling

After Representative Robbins wrapped up, Lion Tim Conaway shared information about Lions KidSight and what Kidsight is doing in Minnesota and MD5M. In 2023, approximately 39,000 children between the ages of 6 months and 18 years were screened. Typically, 10-12% of those screened are identified as having a potential sight issue and are given a referral for a follow-up eye exam with eye-care professionals.





Following Lion Tim, Lion Jeff Johnson, the Executive Director of Can Do Canines, presented yellow lab Tucker, a Can Do dog that has been matched to a recipient for placement, but not yet placed. He gave information on the Whelping and Growth (WAG) Center in New Germany and their primary facility in New Hope. He thanked the Lions for their support and said that this year the Lions will surpass the \$4 million donation mark to Can Do Canines since Lions began supporting them.

There was a Lions Code of Ethics from 1921 on display courtesy of District 5M-5. Each year at the 5M-5 Convention, this Code of Ethics sign is auctioned off and the winning club gets to keep it until the next Convention. The proceeds from the auction go to LCIF and this year's winner was the Osseo Lions.

This was the first year of having Lions Day at the Capitol to get more visibility for Lions and to have a dialogue with our State Senators and Representatives about what Lions do and how we can work together.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT SPECIAL OLYMPICS OPENING EYES

Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games is at the University of Minnesota from June 20-22nd.

The university of Minnesota will host the annual Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games! Roughly 3,000 athletes will be competing in basketball, basketball, swimming, and gymnastics throughout the weekend. Outside of competition, there will be entertainment in the athlete Village, health screenings for athletes, Celebration Ceremonies, and many other activities for everyone! Summer Games is open to the public and family friendly!

The Lions have played a major part in this competition for many years, and will once again host the Opening Eyes screening. As part of the Healthy Athletes program offerings, Opening Eyes provides a complete eye exam, conducted by eye doctors and eye care professionals. 
